INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

Presentation and First Reading

TAX (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL 1973 - Bill No. 27/1973 Dublished 10.12.73

The Minister of Finance, on behalf of the Government, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO AMEND THE TAX ORDINANCE.

Before the commencement of Public Business, the Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House informed the Assembly that it was agreed, in consultation with the Opposition, to proceed first with Item 2 (Motion to approve the Estimates of Appenditure) for financial year 1974) on the Order Paper.

MOTIONS.

ITEM 1 - APPROVAL OF THE ESTIMATES OF EXPENDITURE FOR 1974

In accordance with article 80(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance signified that Cabinet had recommended that the Assembly should proceed upon the motion for the approval of the estimates of expenditure for the financial year 1974, totalling \$337,303,150, net of appropriation—in—aid and excluding \$57,887,933, which is chargeable by law. (See Appendix).

The Minister of Finance then moved the motion and read the Budget Speech.

The motion was then proposed.

Thereafter the Minister of Finance named Thursday, 13th December, 1973, as the day for the resumption of the debate on the motion.

Copies of the Estimates, the motion, and the Budget Speech. were then circulated to Members.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee of Supply to consider Financial Paper No. 6/1973.

In Committee of Supply

In accordance with article 80(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance signified Cabinet's recommendation and moved the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Committee of Supply approve of the proposals set out in Financial Paper No. 6/1973 - Statement of amounts withdrawn from the Consolidated Fund under article 112(3) of the Constitution totalling \$23,110,708, for the period ending 17th October, 1973.

After consideration of the Schedule to the Financial Paper the motion was put and <u>carried</u>:

On a motion by the Minister of Finance, the Assembly adopted the following Resolution:

RESOLVED, That this National Assembly agree with the Committee of Supply in the following Resolution:

"RESOLVED, That the Committee of Supply approve of the proposals set out in Financial Paper No. 6/1973 - Statement of amounts withdrawn from the Consolidated Fund under article 112(3) of the Constitution totalling \$23,110,708, for the period ending 17th October, 1973."

ITEM 3 - CONFIRMATION OF CUSTOMS (EXEMPTION FROM DUTIES) ORDER 1973 (NO. 136)

The Minister of Finance moved the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly in terms of section 9 of the Customs Ordinance, Chapter 309, confirm the Customs (Exemption from Duties) Order 1973 (No. 136), which was made on the 11th of November, 1973, and published in the Gazette on the 17th of November, 1973.

MOTION BY MINISTER OF FINANCE

WHEREAS the Constitution of Guyana requires that estimates of the revenues and expenditure of Guyana for any financial year should be laid before the National Assembly not later than sixty days after the commencement of that year;

AND WHEREAS the Constitution also provides that when the estimates of expenditure have been approved by the Assembly an Appropriation Bill shall be introduced in the Assembly providing for the issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sums necessary to meet that expenditure;

AND WHEREAS estimates of revenues and expenditure of Guyana for the financial year 1974 have been prepared and laid before the Assembly on 10th December, 1973.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly approve the estimates of expenditure for the financial year 1974, of a total sum of Three Hundred and Thirty Seven Million, Three Hundred and Three Thousand, One Hundred and Five Dollars, net of appropriation—in—aid, and excluding Fifty Seven Million, Eight Hundred and Eighty Seven Thousand, Nine Hundred and Thirty Three Dollars, which is chargeable by law, as detailed therein and summarised in the undermentioned schedule, and agree that it is expedient to amend the law and to make further provision in respect of finance.
