WHEREAS in accordance with section 13(36) of the Tax Act, Chapter 80:01, and of Standing Order No. 57(5)(b) of the Standing Orders of the National Assembly, the Promoters of the Guyana Presbyterian Church Bill 1974, paid to the Accountant General on the 5th of January, 1974, the prescribed stamp duty of \$100.00;
