The Minister of Co-operatives and National Mobilisation, on behalf of the Government, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

ITEM 3 - PUBLIC HEALTH (SCHOOL CHILDREN) IMMUNISATION BILL 1974 Bill No. 29/1974 publsihed 21. 9. 74

The Minister of Co-operatives and National Mobilisation, on behalf of the Minister of Health moved the second reading of the following Bill:

> A BILL intituled AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE IMMUNISATION OF PERSENS SEEKING ENTRY INTO SCHOOLS AND DAY-CARE CENTRES AGAINST CERTAIN COMMUNICABLE DISEASES, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES CONNECTED THEREWITHS

Mrs Da Silva spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the Minister of Co-operatives and National Mobilisation replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

The Bill was read a second time.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

In Committee

<u>Clause 1</u> was <u>passed</u> as <u>printed.</u>

<u>Clause 2.</u> The following amendment by the Minister of Co-operatives and National Mobilisation was put and <u>carried.</u>

<u>Substitution</u> of the word "persons" for the word "children" in the definition of school.

Clause 2 was then <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u>.

<u>Clauses 3 to 8</u> were <u>passed</u> as <u>printed</u>.

The Schedule was passed as printed.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Co-operatives and National Mobilisation, the Bill was read the third time and passed as amended in Committee.

ITEM 4 - DEBENTURES (SPECIAL PROVISIONS) BILL 1974 - Bill No. 27/1974 published 19.8.74

In accordance with article 80 (2) of the Constitution the Minister of Economic Development, on behalf of the Minister of Finance, signified Cabinet's recommendation and moved the second reading of the following Bill:

> A BILL intituled AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FUR THE ISSUE OF DEBENTURES BY THE STATE IN SATISFACTION WHELLY OR PARTLY OF THE PURCHASE PRICE OF PROPERTY ACQUIRED BY THE STATE BY PURCHASE.

Thereafter, the Minister of Economic Development replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

The Bill was read a second time and was, thereafter, taken through its remaining stages and <u>passed</u> as <u>printed</u>.

ITEM 5 - LEGAL PRACTITICMERS (AMENDMENT) BILL 1974 - Bill No. 28/1974 published 9.9.74

The Minister of Energy and Natural Resources, on behalf of the Minister of Foreign Affairs and Justice, moved the second reading of the following Bill:

> A BILL intituled AN ACT TG AMEND THE LEGAL PRACTITIONERS ACT AND TO PROVIDE FOR INCIDENTAL MATTERS.

Thereafter, the Minister of Energy and Natural Resources replied.

<u>ITEM 6</u> - <u>CUNTRACT BETWEEN GUYANA TIMBER EXPORT BOARD AND IRADI</u> <u>PORTS ADMINISTRATION FUR THE SALE OF GREENHEART</u>

The Minister of Economic Development, on behalf of the Minister of Finance, moved the following motion:

WHEREAS a contract has been negotiated between the Guyana Timber Export Board and the Iraqi Ports Administration for the sale by the Board of a quantity of greenheart to the Administration at a purchase price of US\$1,018,780.00;

AND WHEREAS under the said contract the Board is required to provide the Administration with a Guarantee securing, in the event of the failure of the Board to carry out its obligations under the contract, the refund by the Board of advance payments made by the administration under the contract which will amount to ninety per cent of the purchase price:

NOW THEREFIRE, BE IT RESULVED:

That this National Assembly do authorise the Government of Guyana to effect the guarantee in favour of the Iraqi Ports Administration as is required under the contract negotiated between the Guyana Timber Export Board and the Administration.
