APPROVAL OF THE ESTIMATES OF EXPENDITURE FOR 1975

In accordance with article 80(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance signified that Cabinet had recommended that the Assembly should proceed upon the motion for the approval of the estimates of expenditure for the financial year 1975, totalling \$458,687,527, net of appropriation-in-aid, and excluding \$72,501,451, which is chargeable by law. (See Appendix).

The Minister of Finance then moved the motion and ${\bf zead}$ the Budget Speech.

The motion was then proposed.

Thereafter, the Minister of Finance named Thursday, 12th December, 1974, as the day for the resumption of the debate on the motion.

APPENDIX

MOTION BY THE MINISTER OF FINANCE

WHEREAS the Constitution of Guyana requires that estimates of the revenues and expenditure of Guyana for any financial year should be laid before the National Assembly not later than sixty days after the commencement of that year;

AND WHEREAS the Constitution also provides that when the estimates of expenditure have been approved by the Assembly an Appropriation Bill shall be introduced in the Assembly providing for the issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sums necessary to meet that expenditure;

AND WHEREAS estimates of revenues and expenditure of Guyana for the financial year 1975 have been prepared and laid before the Assembly on 9th December, 1974;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESCLVED:

That this National Assembly approve the estimates of expenditure for the financial year 1975, of a total sum of four hundred and fifty eight million, six hundred and eighty seven thousand, five hundred and twenty seven dollars, net of appropriation-in-aid, and excluding seventy two million, five hundred and one thousand, four hundred and fifty one dollars, which is chargeable by law, as detailed therein and summarised in the undermentioned schedule, and agree that it is expedient to amend the law and to make further provision in respect of finance.
