INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

Presentation and First Reading

(1) SEA DEFENCES (AMCNDMENT) BILL 1975 - Bill No. 14/1975

The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House, on behalf of the Minister of Agriculture, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

The Minister of Home Affairs, on behalf of the Government presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO ENABLE MEMBERS
OF THE POLICE FORCE TO APPEAL TO THE
POLICE SERVICE COMMISSION IN DISCIPLINARY
MATTERS PURSUANT TO ACTICLE 108(5) OF THE
CONSTITUTION AND TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE
EXERCISE OF DISCIPLINARY POWERS IN THE
POLICE FORCE.

PUBLIC BUSINESS

BILL - Second and Third Readings

Item 1 - <u>IRADE (AMENDMENT) BILL 1975 - Bill No. 13/1975) published</u> 22.3.75

The Minister of Trade and Consumer Protection moved the second reading of the following Bill:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO AMEND THE TRADE ACT.

Mrs. Da Silva and the Leader $\circ f$ the Opposition spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the Minister of Trade and Consumer Protection replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

The Bill was read a second time.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 4.00 p.m. the sitting was suspended.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 4.25 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

In Committee

Clause 1 was passed as printed.

- Clause 2: The following amendments by the Leader of the Opposition were put and negatived:
 - (a) <u>Insertion</u> of the words "convicted for an offence aforceaid," between the words "employee" and "if" in the first line in the proposed new subsection (5)(c) of section 5.
 - (b) <u>Deletion</u> of words ", which approval shall not be given prior to the expiration of two years from date the disqualification commenced where the premises are situated in Georgetown, New Amsterdam or in any other town established under the Municipal and District Councils Act".

The following amendment by Mrs. Da Silva was put and negatived:

<u>Deletion</u> of the existing subsection (4)(b) of section 5 of the Principal Act and the <u>substitution</u> therefor of the following -

" (4) (b) a fine of not less nor more than three thousand dollars together with imprisionment for not less nor more than three years, on a second or subsequent occasion."

The following amendments by the Minister of Trade and Consumer Protection were put and carried:

- (a) <u>Deletion</u> of the words "subsequent to the coming into operation of this subsection" in the ninth and tenth lines and <u>insertion</u> of those words immediately after the words "carrying on" in the twelfth line in the proposed subsection (5) to section 5 of the Principal Act.
- (b) <u>Deletion</u> of the words "paragraphs (a) and" in the first and second lines and <u>substitution</u> therefor of the word "paragraph" in the proposed subsection (7) to section 5 of the Principal Act.
- (c) $\underline{\text{Addition}}$ of the following subsection as subsection (10) of section 5 of the Principal Act -
 - "(10) Any person disqualified from holding a licence under subsection (5) or (7) who to the satisfaction of the court is shown to frequent premises with respect to which the disqualification arose and at which business as mentioned in those subsections is carried on shall, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that his presence thereat related to the transaction of business as a customer, be deemed to be engaged in the carrying on of business contrary to subsection (9)(b).

Clause 2 was then passed as amended.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Trade and Consumer Protectio the Bill was read the third time and \underline{passed} as $\underline{amended}$ in Committee.

Item 2 - CONFIRMATION OF THE PURCHASE TAX (MOTOR CARS)(AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) ORDER 1975 (NO. 29)

The Minister of Finance moved the following motion: BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly in accordance with section 5A of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act, Chapter 51:02, confirm the Purchase Tax (Motor Cars) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1975 (No. 29), which was made on the 20th of March, 1975, and published in the Gazette on the 20th of March, 1975.

The Leader of the Opposition spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the Minister of Finance replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

At 5.55 p.m., on a motion by the Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House, the Assembly was adjourned to a date to be fixed.
