#### QUESTIONS TO MINISTERS

#### Question No. 10

<u>Cde. Mohamed</u> asked the Minister of Education, Social Development and Culture the following question:

QUESTION:

Is the Minister of Education, Social Development and Culture aware that there is a severe lack of teachers for the 'A' level classes at the Anna Regina Multi-lateral School and will the Minister correct this situation in time to help the Sixth Form students who are taking the June 1977 G.C.E. Examination?

The Minister of Education, Social Development and Culture gave the following reply:

ANSWER:

The Minister is not aware of, nor is there a severe lack of teachers for the 'A' level classes at the Anna Regina Miltilateral School.

The Sixth Form is staffed by graduates in all but one of the subjects being offered by the students taking the June 1977 G.C.E. Examinations, the exception being Biology where the teacher is a trained non-graduate with ten years teaching experience.

A Supplementary Question was aksed by Cde. Mohamed.

#### Question No. 11

<u>Cde. Mohamed</u> asked the Minister of Education, Social Development and Culture the following question:

QUESTION:

Is the Minister of Education, Social
Development and Culture aware that there
are large numbers of children of kindergarten age at Covent Garden, East Bank,
Demerara, who cannot attend school at
Prospect because of lack of accommodation?

Since the kindergarten at Prospect is filled to capacity, will the Minister consider establishing one for Covent Garden?

The Minister of Education, Social Development and Culture gave the following reply:

ANSWER:

The then Minister clearly stated at the time the Constitution (Amendment) Bill was being debated in 1976 that it would not be possible to accommodate all children of nursery school age immediately, and that the introduction of such education would have to be phased. I wish to state

that the need for a school at Covent Garden is being examined in the context of the needs of the whole country.

The Ministry of Education, Social Development and Culture is prepared to work in co-operation with, and would welcome participation by that community, in the area under discussion, and other communities, in the establishment of nursery schools in their respective areas.

A Supplementary Question was asked by Cde. Mohamed.

#### Question No. 12

<u>Cde. Ram Karran</u> asked the Minister of Education, Social Development and Culture the following question:

QUESTION:

Is the Minister of Education, Social Development and Culture aware of the fact that the Special Delegates' Conference of the Guyana Trades Union Congress at its meeting on Saturday, January 29, 1977, unanimously approved a resolution calling for the immediate employment of Guyanese Historian, Dr. Walter Rodney, at the University of Guyana?

In view of the Government's often-expressed policy of encouraging qualified Guyanese to bring home their skills and expertise and also repeated statements that its aim is socialism, does the Minister agree that it is an anomalous situation that an eminently-qualified Guyanese like Dr. Rodney, a socialist, has not been permitted for more than two years to take up the appointment of Professor of History at the University which he had been offered and had accepted?

Whatever the answer is to either of these questions, will the Minister say whether or not the decision not to employ Dr. Rodney will be reconsidered as a matter of urgency?

The Minister of Education, Social Development and Culture gave the following reply:

ANSWER:

The Minister is aware of the resolution adopted at the Special Delegates' Conference of the Trades Union Congress regarding the employment of Dr. Walter Rodney at the University of Guyana.

The Minister wishes to point out that the University of Guyana Act and Statutes vest the power to make appointments in the Board of Governors of the University, with whom the General Secretary of the T.U.C. has properly raised the matter in pursuance of the resolution to which reference is made.

The Deputy Speaker moved the following amendment:

To the proposed section 8(2):

<u>Deletion</u> of paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (d), and substitution of the following therefor:

- " (a) one cane farmer within the meaning of the National Cane Farming Committee Act;
  - (b) six persons nominated by the three Trade Unions concerned with the welfare of labour workers in the sugar industry to be nominated from among their membership; and
  - (c) one public officer.

The Chairman shall be elected from among the members. "

Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud moved the following amendment:

To the proposed section 8(1):

Substitution of the words "three representatives named by the recognised unions in the sugar industry" for the words "two public officers" appearing in paragraph (c).

The amendments by Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud and by the Deputy Speaker were put and <u>negatived</u>.

(5) The provisions of subsection (1) to (4) inclusive shall in so far as they apply to a representative of a trade union or an official apply mutatis mutandis to a Member of the National Assembly for the purposes of the exercise by him of the privileges and powers conferred by subsection 1(a) upon such a representative or official.". '
