A BILL intituled AN ACT TO AMEND THE PUBLIC CORPORATIONS ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF AN EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT AND MORE THAN ONE VICE PRESIDENT.

Cde. N. Persaud and Mr. Singh spoke to the motion.

The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House replied.

The motion was put and carried.

The Bill was read a second time.

- <u>Clause 1</u> The Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House moved the following amendments which were put and carrieds-
 - (a) <u>Insertion</u> of the words "and commencement" immediately after the words "Short title" in the marginal note.
 - (b) <u>Insertion</u> of the words "and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 15th May, 1979." after the figure "1979".

Clause 1 was thom passod as amended.

Clauses 2 to 4 were passed as printed.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House, the Bill was read the third time and passed as amended.
