(2) Death of Former Members of Parliament - Mr. Mohamed Idris Deen and Mr.

## Ali Baksh

"Honourable Members, I was informed of the death of Mr. Mohamed Idris Deen, a former Member of Parliament, who died on the $13^{\text {th }}$ November, 2017, in Toronto Canada, after a brief illness. He was 86 years old having born on the $9^{\text {th }}$ March, 1931.

Mr. Deen came from the People's National Congress following the Elections which were held on $9^{\text {th }}$ December, 1985.The Fifth Parliament commenced when the National Assembly first met on $3^{\text {rd }}$ February, 1986. Mr. Deen first became a Member of the National Assembly on the $24^{\text {th }}$ December, 1985. Mr. Deen worked throughout the life of the Fifth Parliament, which life was extended from time to time from $3^{\text {rd }}$ February, 1986 to $10^{\text {th }}$ June, 1992 and was dissolved on $29^{\text {th }}$ August.

Elections were again held on $5^{\text {th }}$ October, 1992. The Sixth Parliament commenced when the National Assembly first met on $17^{\text {th }}$ December, 1992. During the latter part of the Sixth Parliament, Mr. Deen again became a Member of the National Assembly on $3^{\text {rd }}$ March, 1994, following the resignation of Mr. Sase Narain from $8^{\text {th }}$ February, 1994. On the $29^{\text {th }}$ October, 1997, the Sixth Parliament was dissolved. Mr. Deen ceased to be a legislator on the $28^{\text {th }}$ October, 1997.

Honourable Members, I was also informed of the death of Mr. Ali Baksh, a former Member of Parliament, who died on the $23^{\text {rd }}$ November, 2017, at 5 Cotton Field Essequibo Coast, after a brief illness. He was 70 years old, having born on the $11^{\text {th }}$ June, 1947. Mr. Baksh came from the People's Progressive Party/Civic.

Following the Elections which were held on the $28^{\text {th }}$ November, 2011, the Tenth Parliament commenced when the National first met on $12^{\text {th }}$ January, 2012. Mr. Baksh first became a Member of the National Assembly on the $5^{\text {th }}$ December, 2011, and was appointed a Minister in the Ministry of Agriculture.

Mr. Baksh worked in the Tenth Parliament until it was dissolved on the $28^{\text {th }}$ February, 2015. As a Minister of the Government and with the dissolution of Parliament, Mr. Baksh continued to work until the $15^{\text {th }}$ May, 2015. Mr. Baksh ceased to be a legislator on the $16^{\text {th }}$ May, 2015.
