(i) BAUXITE AGREEMENTS (ADAPTATION AND MODIFICATION OF LAWS BILL, 1969 - Bill No. 11/1969

The Minister of Finance on behalf of the Government, presented the following Bill which was read the first time:

- A BILL intituled AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADAPTATION AND MODIFICATION OF LAWS TOUCHING THE CARRYING INTO EFFECT OF THE TWO ACREEMENTS ENTERED INTO BY THE GOVERNMENT OF BRITISH GUIANA WITH THE REYNOLDS METALS COMPANY AND THE DEMERARA BAUXITE COMPANY, LIMITED, RESPECTIVELY.

- (111) LOCAL COVERNMENT (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1969 BILL No. 10/1969

The Minister of Local Government on behalf of the Government, presented the following Bills which were read the first time:

- (i) A BILL intituled AN ACT TO AMEND THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE.
- (ii) A BILL intituled AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE VILUATION OF PROPERTY FOR RATING PURPOSES AND FOR MATTERS CONNECTED THERETITH.

PUBLIC BUSINESS

BILL - Second and Third Readings

Item 1 - ATKINSON AIRPORT (CHANGE OF NAME) BILL, 1969 -Bill No. 8/1969 published 29.4.69

On a motion by the Minister of Communications, Standing Order No. 46(2) and (3) was suspended to enable the Assembly to proceed with the second reading of the ATKINSON AIRPORT (CHANGE OF NAME) BILL, 1969, at that sitting.

The Minister of Communications then moved the second reading of the following Bill:

A BLUE intituled AN ACT TO EFFECT CHANGES IN THE NAMES OF ATKINSON AIRPORT AND ATKINSON AERODROME AND TO AMEND CHAPTER 282.

Mr. Ram Karran and Mr. Sutton spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the Minister of Communications replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

The Bill was then read a second time.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

In Committee

Clauses 1 to 2 were passed as printed.

Clause 3 - The following amendment by the Minister of Communications was put and carried:

Deletion of the words "Timehri International" in the first line of subsection (1) and the substitution therefor of the word "Atkinson".

Clause 3 was then passed as amended.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Communications, the Bill was read a third time and passed as ammended in Committee.

MOTION

Item 2 - MOTION TO APPROVE FINANCIAL PAPER NO. 2 of 1969

On a motion by the Minister of Finance Standing Order No. 69 was suspended to enable the motion for the approval of Financial Paper No. 2 of 1969 to be proceeded with at that sitting.

In terms of article 80(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance signified the Cabinet's recommendation.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee of Supply.

In Committee of Supply

The Minister of Finance moved the following motion which was put and carried.

That the Committee of Supply approve of the proposals set out in Financial Paper No. 2/1969 - Schedule of Supplementary Provision on the Current Estimates for the period ending 30th April, 1969, totalling \$2,500,000.00.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Finance the Assembly adopted the following Resolution:

RESOLVED, That this National Assembly agree with the Committee of Supply in the following Resolution:

"RESOLVED, That the Committee of Supply approve of the proposals set out in Financial Paper No. 2/1969 - Schedule of Supplementary Provision on the Current Estimates for the period ending 30th April, 1969 - totalling \$2,500,000.00."
