# ITEM 6 - MOTION TO ENABLE A MEMBER TO RENOUNCE ALL RIGHTS TO THE PAYMENT TO HIM OF DUTY ALLOWANCE

WHEREAS by virtue of the Constitutional Offices (Holders' Allowances) Order, 1969, provision has been made for the payment of duty allowances to Members of the National Assembly;

AND THEREAS certain Members of the National Assembly have expressed disagreement with the making of such provision:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That any Member of the National Assembly may, within seven days of this resolution, by declaration under his hand to His Honour the Speaker signifying his disagreement on grounds of conscience or otherwise with the payment of a duty allowance under the Constitutional Offices (Holders Allowances) Order, 1969, renounce all rights to the payment to him of such allowance.
