# QUESTION NO. 6

Mr. Balchand Persaud asked the Minister of Health the follow-question:

Question: Will the Honourable Minister say -

- (i) what steps have been taken to implement Resolution No. XLVII of the 16th of October, 1968, in regards to cigarette smoking?
- (ii) If the answer is in the negative, will the Honourable Minister indicate how soon will steps be taken to implement the resolution?

The Minister of Health gave the following reply:

Answer:

- (i) The Division of Health Education has been emphasising in lectures the dangers which can result from cigarette smoking. It is felt that some measures of success has been achieved by means of these lectures.
- (ii) Government is exploring the possibility of introducing legislation to -
  - (a) deal with labelling of cigarette packs;
  - (b) restrict smoking advertisements in the news media, i.e. theatre, newspaper and radio.

# MOTION TO GUARANTEE THE REPAYMENT OF THE NEW AMSTERDAM TOWN COUNCIL'S ISSUE OF EQUATED ANNUITY BEARER BONDS

In accordance with article 80(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance signified the Cabinet's recommendation and moved the following motion:

#### BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Government guarantee the repayment of the sum of \$500,000 which the New Amsterdam

Town Council proposes to borrow, in accordance with section 196 of the New Amsterdam Town Council Ordinance, Chapter 161, from the public by the issue of equated annuity bearer bonds on the 1st October, 1969, at seven per cent per annum repayable in 15 years, in order to reconstruct certain roads in New Amsterdam.

Mr. Ram Karran spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the Minister of Finance replied.

The motion was then put and carried.
