QUESTIONS TO MINISTERS

QUESTION NO. 12

Mr. R. Ally asked the Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply the following question:

<u>Question</u>: Will the Honourable Minister indicate how early the residents of Nos. 60 - 66 Villages may expect to obtain pure water and what is the position with respect to the artesian well at No. 63?

The Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply gave the following reply:

Answer: The well is complete and the residents are getting water.

QUESTION NO. 13

Mr. R. Ally asked the Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply the following question:

- Question: (i) Is the Honourable Minister aware that the residents of Crabwood Creek are forced to drink water from trenches, which is injurious to their health?
 - (ii) Will he indicate how early these residents may expect a supply of artesian well water?
 - (iii) Will he indicate the reason for the abandonment of the work on the artesian well at Crabwood Creek?

The Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply gave the following reply:

Answer: The residents, as far as I know, are not forced to drink water from trenches. It is not injurious to their health and we have not received such a report.

With respect to the second part of the question, we are mobilising our forces to do the drilling. In fact they have already erected a stand pipe.

On a motion by the Minister of Education (Leader of the House) Standing Order No. 46, paragraphs (2) and (3), was suspended to enable the Assembly to proceed with items 1 and 2 on the Order Paper.

BILLS - Second and Third Readings

ITEM 2 - INTERPRETATION AND GENERAL CLAUSES BILL, 1970 -Bill No. 7/1970 published 13.2.70

The Attorney-General and Minister of State moved the second reading of the following Bill:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO CONSOLIDATE THE LAW RELATING TO THE CONSTRUCTION AND INTERPRETATION OF ACTS OF PARLIAMENT, SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION, APPLIED LAWS AND PUBLIC DOCUMENTS AND TO MAKE GENERAL PROVISION FOR MATTERS CONNECTED WITH OR SIMILAR TO THE PURPOSE AFORESAID.

Dr. Ramsahoye and Mr. D.C. Jagan spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the motion was put and carried.

The Bill was read a second time.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

In Committee

Clauses 1 to 3 were passed as printed.

Clause 4 - The following amendments by the Attorney-General and Minister of State were put and <u>carried</u>:

Subsection (1):

- (a) <u>Deletion</u> of the words "and any dependency of a Commonwealth country" in the definition of a "Commonwealth Country".
- (b) <u>Insertion</u> of the following definition immediately after the definition of "Commonwealth country" -
 - 1 "Commonwealth territory" means a Commonwealth country or a dependency of a Commonwealth country; *
- (c) In the definition of"public account" -
 - (i) <u>Substitution</u> of the words "the Government" for the word "Guyana".
 - (ii) Substitution of the words "a written law" for the words "an Act".

- (d) <u>Deletion</u> of the words ", or made under or by virtue of any applied Act by an authority in Guyana and having legislative effect" in the definition of "subsidiary legislation".
- (e) <u>Substitution</u> of the word "Commission" for the word "Commissioner" in the definition of "Service Commissioner".

Clause 4 was then passed as amended,

Clauses 5 to 7 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 8</u> - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and <u>carried</u>:

Substitution of the word "may" for the word "shall" where it appears for the first time in subsection (3)

Clause 8 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 9 to 11 were passed as printed.

Clause 12 - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and carried:

Insertion of the word "for" immediately before
the words "all purposes".

Clause 12 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 13 and 14 were passed as printed

<u>Clause 15</u> - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and <u>carried</u>:

Substitution of the word "substituted" in the proviso to paragraph (d) for the word "replacing" in the fifth line of subsection (1).

Clause 15 was then passed as amended.

- Clause 16 The following amendments by the Attorney-General and Minister of State were put and carried:
 - (a) <u>Deletion</u> of the words "including rules of court" and <u>insertion</u> of a comma after the word "rules" of subsection (1);
 - (b) <u>Deletion</u> of the word "made" in the last line of subsection (2).

Clause 16. was then passed as amended.

Clauses 17 and 18 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 19</u> - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and <u>carried</u>:

Substitution of the words and figures "Sections 9, 11 and 12" for the words and figures "Sections 9, 11, 12 and 52".

Clause 19 was then passed as amended.

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Clause 20 was passed as printed.

Clause 21 - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and carried:

Insertion of the words "appointing a person by name or by" immediately after the words "either by" in the eighth line of subsection (3).

Clause 21 was then passed as amended.

Clause 22 was passed as printed.

<u>Clause 23</u> - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and <u>carried</u>:

Insertion of the word "on" immediately after
the word "power" in the first line of subsection (1).

Clause 23 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 24 to 27 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 28</u> - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and <u>carried</u>:

Deletion of the words "written law to be" in the sixth line of subsection (2) and <u>sub-</u> <u>stitution</u> therefor of the words "done to, on or against the Attorney General, may be".

Clause 28 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 29 to 35 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 36</u> - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and <u>carried</u>:

Substitution of the words "written law" for the word "Act".

Clause 36 was then passed as amended.

<u>Clause 37</u> - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and <u>carried</u>:

Insertion of the word "is" immediately before
the word "substantially" in the seventh line.

Clause 37 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 38 to 43 were passed as printed.

Clause 44 - The following amendments by the Attorney-General and Minister of State were put and carried:

(a) <u>Deletion</u> of the words "substitute - for" and <u>insertion</u> of a hyphen;

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(b) <u>Insertion</u> of the following words "privilege, obligation, liability, penalty, forfeiture, or punishment aforesaid" immediately after the word "right" in paragraph (e).

Clause 44 was then passed as amended.

Clause 45 was passed as printed.

<u>Clause 46</u> - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and carried:

<u>Deletion</u> of the word "other" in the fourth line of subsection (1).

Clause 46 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 47 and 48 were passed as printed.

Clause 49 - The following amendment by the Attorney-General and Minister of State was put and carried:

Substitution of the words "written law" for the word "Act" in the first and last lines.

Clause 49 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 50 to 53 were passed as printed.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Attorney-General and Minister of State the Bill was read a third time and passed as amended in Committee.
