Substitution of a colon for the full stop at the end of the clause and <u>addition</u> of the following proviso:

Provided that where an employee of a dissolved village council or country authority is not appointed to a local government office in a new council, such employee shall be awarded redundancy payment by the council to which the property is transferred in a sum being not less than two years emoluments calculated on the basis of the employee's rate of pay at the time of the dissolution. "

On a motion by the Minister of Local Government, the following Bill was read a second time:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO AMEND CERTAIN ENACTMENTS RELATING TO LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND TO VALIDATE THE APPOINTMENT AND ACTS OF CERTAIN PERSONS WHO PURPORTED TO EXERCISE THE FUNCTIONS OF MEMBERS OF THOSE AUTHORITIES.

Thereafter the Bill was taken through the remaining stages and passed as printed.
