STATEMENTS BY MINISTERS

Statement by the Minister of Trade on the expansion of the activities of the External Trade Bureau

The Minister of Trade made a statement on the Government's decision to expand the activities of the External Trade Bureau, which was established in July, 1970, to handle imports from certain centries as a first step towards imposing effective control on prices of goods sold in Guyana, to include the importation, with immediate effect, of certain categories of widely used foodstuffs, essential drugs, bulk chemicals and hospital and laboratory supplies.
