PUBLIC BUSINESS

BILLS - Second and Third Readings

ITEM 1 - LIVESTOCK (LOANS FOR DEVELOPMENT) BILL. 1971 -Bill No. 19/1971 published 7.8.71

The Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Agriculture moved the second reading of the following Bill:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR FACILITATING THE RAISING OF LOANS BY PERSONS ENGAGED IN THE REARING OF LIVESTOCK AND FOR MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH.

Mr. Reepu Daman Persaud and Mr. D.C. Jagan spoke to the motion.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 4.00 p.m. the sitting was suspended for tea.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 4.30 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

Mr. R. Ally, Mr. Wilson, Mr. M.Y. Ally and Mr. Ram Karran spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Agriculture replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

The Bill was read a second time.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

In Committee

Clauses 1 to 11 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 12</u> - The following amendment by Mr. M.Y. Ally was put and <u>carried</u>:

> <u>Insertion</u> of the words "or any other person" immediately after the word "butcher" in the first line of the proposed section 14A at paragraph (f).

Clause 12 was then passed as amended.

The First and Second Schedules were passed as printed.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Agriculture, the Bill was read the third time and <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u> in Committee.

ITEM 2 - TAX (AMENDMENT) BILL. 1971 - Bill No. 16/1971 published 28.7.71

In accordance with article BD(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance signified Cabinet's recommendation and moved the second reading of the following Bill:

> A BILL intituled AN ACT TO AMEND THE TAX ORDINANCE.

The Minister was still speaking to the motion when the time for the suspension of the sitting was reached.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 6.30 p.m. the sitting was suspended.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 8.08 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

Assembly resumed the debate on the second reading of the Tax (Amendment) Bill, 1971.

The Minister of Finance concluded his speech.

Mr. D.C. Jagan spoke to the motion.

Mr. Teekah was speaking to the motion when at 9.57 p.m., the debate was interrupted to enable the Minister of Housing and Reconstruction(Leader of the House), to move the suspension of Standing Order No. 9(1).

SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDER NO. 9(1)

On a motion by the Minister of Housing and Reconstruction (Leader of the House), Standing Order No. 9(1) was suspended to enable the Assembly to sit beyond 10.00 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF DEBATE

Mr. Teekah concluded his speech.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 10.00 p.m. the sitting was suspended for coffee.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 10.17 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

Mr. M.F. Singh and Mr. Lall spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the Minister of Finance replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

The Bill was read a second time.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

In Committee

Clause 1 was passed as printed.

<u>Clause 2</u> - The following amendments by the Minister of Finance were put and <u>carried</u>:

In the proposed section 35 at paragraph (c):

- (a) <u>Substitution</u> of the following subsection for subsection (2):
 - "(2) Save as hereinafter provided in this section no person shall be entitled to obtain a certificate unless he has (the burden of proof whereof shall lie on him) delivered to the Commissioner all returns which up to the date of his application for a certificate he is required by section 40 of the Income Tax Ordinance so to deliver and has up to that date complied with section 47A of that Ordinance, if that section is applicable to him.";

(b) In subsection (9) -

 (i) <u>Substitution</u> of the words "one thousand" for the words "two thousand" and the words "three thousand" for the words "five thousand" in paragraph (a);

- (ii) Addition of the following paragraph -
 - "(c) For the purposes of proceedings instituted against anyone alleged to be in breach of subsection (1) upon proof that such person practised as a person mentioned in the first schedule it shall be presumed, unless the contrary is shown by such person, that he did at the alleged time practice for reward.";
- (c) <u>Substitution</u> of the following for subsection (13) -
 - " (13) The provisions of this section shall have effect notwithstanding the provisions of any other law authorising any person to practise as a person mentioned in the first schedule and the grant of a certificate shall not entitle any person to do anything which would otherwise be unlawful."; and
- (d) <u>Deletion</u> of the definition of the word "optician" appearing in subsection (15).

Clause 2 was then passed as amended.

- <u>Schedule</u> The following amendments by the Minister of Finance were put and carried:
 - (a) <u>Deletion</u> of all references to "Optician" in the proposed First Schedule;
 - (b) In the proposed Second Schedule:
 - (i) <u>Insertion</u> of the words "or Class of Persons" in the heading to the first column, immediately after the words "Professional Body";
 - (ii) Substitution of the words "The Association of Cortified Accountants" in the first column of paragraph (c);
 - (iii) Substitution of the initials "A.C.C.A."
 and "F.C.C.A." in the third column
 for the initials "A.A.C.C.A." and
 "F.A.C.C.A." respectively; and
 - (c) <u>Substitution</u> of the word "Institution" for the word "Institute" wherever it appears in the first column of the proposed Fourth Schedule.

The Schedule was then passed as amended.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Finance, the Bill was read the third time and passed as amended in Committee.

At 11.37 p.m., on a motion by the Minister of Housing and Reconstruction (Leader of the House), the Assembly was adjourned to 2.00 p.m. on Monday, the 23rd of August, 1971.
