PUBLIC BUSINESS

MOTION

ITEM 1 - MOTION ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A RADIO AND FLYING DOCTOR SERVICE

Mrs. Da⁵ilva moved and Mr. Chandisingh seconded the following motion:

WHEREAS many areas in the Interior of Guyana inhabited principally by Amerindians, are either without medical services or the services are totally inadequate;

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AND WHEREAS it is the declared policy of the Government to encourage further settlement of the Interior;

AND WHEREAS finance does not seem to be available for providing further hospitals, clinics and dispensaries in the Interior:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Government consider the establishment of a Radio and Flying Doctor Service to help fill the present gap in Interior Medical Services in Guyana.

The Minister of Health spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, Mrs. DaSilva replied.

The motion was then put and negatived.

BILL - Second and Third Readings

ITEM 2 - PRIVATE HOSPITALS BILL 1971 - Bill No. 15.1971 published 14.7.71

Assembly resumed the debate on the second reading of the following Bill:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO MAKE PROVISION FOR THE LICENSING OF PRIVATE HOSPITALS AND FOR PURPOSES CONNECTED THEREWITH.

Mr. Chandisingh concluded his speech.

The Minister of Health was replying when the time for the suspension of the sitting was reached.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 4.00 p.m. the sitting was suspended for refreshments.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 4.32 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

The Minister of Health concluded her speech.

Thereafter the motion for the second reading of the Bill was put and <u>rerried</u>.

The Bill was then read a second time.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

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In Committee

<u>Clause 1</u> was passed with the following correction: Substitution of "1972" for "1971".

<u>Clause 2</u> - The following amendment by Mrs. DaSilva to the definition of "private hospital" in subsection (1) was <u>negatived</u>:

Insertion of a comma after the words "convalescent home".

Deletion of the words "or nursing home,", and

Insertion of the words "nursing home, or home institution for the care and treatment of persons receiving or requiring phychiatric treatment," between the words "convalescent home" and "but does not include".

Clause 2 was then passed as printed.

<u>Clause 3</u> - The following amendment by Mr. Chandisingh to subsection (3) was <u>negatived:</u>

> <u>Deletion</u> of the words "or in the admission thereto or treatment of any patient therein".

- Clause 3 was then passed as printed.
- Clause 4 was passed as printed.
- <u>Clause 5</u> The following amendment by Mr. Chandisingh to subsection (1) was <u>carried</u>:

Substitution of the words "the prescribed fee" for the words "a fee of five hundred dollars".

The following amendment by Mrs, DaSilva to the proviso to subsection (1) was <u>negatived</u>:

Insertion of a comma after the word "thereat", and,

Addition of the words "or a non-profit association formed under section 20 Chapter of the Companies Ordinance". 328.

Clause 5 was then passed as amended.

Clause 6 was passed as printed.

<u>Clause 7</u> - Mr. D.C. Jagan moved the following amendment to subsection (2):

Deletion of the word "surgical".

After discussion, consideration of Clause 7 was deferred.

Clause 8 was passed as printed.

<u>Clause 9</u> - The following amendment by Mr. D.C. Jagan to subsection (1)(b) was <u>negatived</u>:

Substitution of the word "and" for the word "but", and

Deletion of the word "not".

Clause 9 was then passed as printed.

<u>Clause 10</u> - The following amendment by Mr. D.C. Jagan to subsection (2) was <u>carried</u>:

> <u>Substitution</u> of the word "or" for the word "and" between the words "licensee" and "of" in the fourth line.

Clause 10 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 11 and 12 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 13</u> - The following amendment by the Minister of Health to subsection (1) was <u>carried</u>: <u>Insertion</u> of the word "and" after the <u>semi-</u> colon at the end of paragraph (d), and

Deletion of paragraphs (e) and (f), and

Re-lettering of paragraph (g) as paragraph (e).

The following amendments by Mr. Chandisingh to subsections (2) and (3) were <u>negatived</u>:

<u>Substitution</u> of the word "forty-eight" for the word "twenty-four".

The following amendment by the Minister of Health to subsection (2) was <u>carried</u>:

Insertion of the words "or any other persons designated by him," after the word "Minister".

Clause 13 was then passed as amended.

<u>Clause 14</u> - The following amendment by Mr. Chandisingh to subsection (1) was <u>negatived</u>:

Insertion of the word "external" between the words "No" and "structural".

The following amendment by the Minister of Health to subsection (1) was <u>carried</u>:

Insertion of the word "of" between the words "plan" and "the".

Clause 14 was then passed as amended.

<u>Clause 15</u> - The following amendment by Mrs. DaSilva to subsection (1) was <u>negatived</u>:

Insertion of the words "who have no interest in any private hospital and have experience in hospital administration"between the words "medical practitioners" and "to be inspectors".

The following amendment by the Minister of Health to subsection (4) was <u>carried</u>:

Insertion of the words "and such other persons as the Minister may consider necessary" immediately after the word "midwife".

Clause 15 was then passed as amonded.

Clauses 16 to 18 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 19</u> - The following amendment by the Minister of Health was <u>carried</u>:

<u>Substitution</u> of the following paragraph for paragraph (h):

" (h) the records, books, reports, returns and other documents to be made and kept in respect of private hospitals and the production to, and inspection by, the Ministeror any person authorised by him of such records, books, reports, returns and documents;"

The following amendment by Mr. D.C. Jagan was <u>negatived</u>:

Re-numbering of the clause as subsection (1), end

Insertion of the following as subsection (2):

" (2) Regulations made in pursuance of this section and any amendment or varia tion thereof shall be subject to an affirmative resolution. "

Clause 19 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 20 to 22 and the Schedule were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 7</u> - The following amendment which was moved by Mr. D.C. Jagan to subsection (2) was <u>negatived</u>:

Deletion of the word "surgical".

The following amendment by the Minister of Health to subsection (4) was <u>carried</u>:-

<u>Substitution</u> of the words "prescribed fee" for the words "fee of five hundred dollars".

Clause 7 was then passed amended.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Health the Bill was read the third time and <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u> in Committee,
