MOTIONS

ITEM 1 - MOTION ON THE SUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDER NO. 82

The Minister of Housing and Reconstruction (Leader of the House) moved the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That Standing Order No. 82 be suspended to permit the Assembly at its Sitting on the 13th of April, 1972, to proceed upon and to dispose of a motion providing for an amendment to Standing Order No. 76.

Mr. Ram Karran spoke to the motion.

Thereafter, the motion was put and carried.

ITEM 2 - MOTION ON THE AMENDMENT OF STANDING ORDER NO. 76

The Minister of Housing and Reconstruction (Leader of the House) moved the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That Standing Order No. 76 be amended by the insertion after the word "Assembly" at the end of paragraph (1) of the words "and the Assembly may on consideration of the report resolve that the Committee shall remain in being and continue its investigation notwithstanding the end of the Sassion".

The Leader of the Opposition, Mr. Reepu Daman Persaud, Mr. Sutton and Mr. Ram Karran spoke to the motion.

Thereafter the motion was put and carried.

ITEM 3 - MOTION ON THE CONTINUATION OF LIFE OF SPECIAL SELECT COMMITTEE

The Minister of Housing and Reconstruction (Leader of the House) moved the following motion which was put and <u>carried</u>:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That, with reference to the Report by the Chairman of the Special Select Committee re Matrimonial Causes, Succession, Abortion, etc., concerning the inability of the Committee to conclude its investigation before the end of the Session, the Assembly agrees that the Committee shall remain in being and continue its investigation notwithstanding the end of the Session.

BILL - Second and Third Readings

ITEM 4 - GUYANA WATER AUTHORITY BILL 1972 - Bill No. 2/1972 published 5.4.72

The Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply moved the second reading of the following Bill:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE GUYANA WATER AUTHORITY AND FOR MATTERS CONNECTED THEREWITH.

Mr. Cheeks was speaking to the motion when the time for the suspension of the sitting was reached.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 4.00 p.m. the sitting was suspended for refreshments.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 4.45 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

Mr. Cheeks concluded his speech.

Mr. Sutton, Dr. Ramsahoye, Mr. R. Ally and Mr. Ram Karran spoke to the motion.

The Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply replied.

Thereafter the motion was put and carried.

The Bill was then read a second time.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 6.45 p.m. the sitting was suspended.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 8.12 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

In Committee

Clause 1 was passed as printed.

- <u>Clause 2</u> The following amendments by the Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply were <u>carried</u>:
 - (i) <u>Substitution</u> of "collecting sewer system" for "collecting sewage system" in the definition;
 - (ii) <u>Substitution</u> of "sewage service" for "sewerage service" in the definition; and
 - (iii) <u>Substitution</u> of the words ",storage, supply and distribution of water," for the words "and disposal of sewage" in the definition of "waterworks".

Clause 2 was then passed as amended.

Clause 3 - The heading "ESTABLISHMENT OF GUYANA WATER AUTHORITY" immediately before Clause 3 was deleted.

Clause 3 was passed as printed.

Clauses 4 and 5 were passed as printed.

- Clause 6 The following amendments by the Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply were <u>carried</u>:
 - (i) <u>Substitution</u> of the following for subsection (1):
 - " (1) Subject to this Act, the Authority shall have the exclusive right to provide sewage services and water services -
 - (a) in those areas of Guyana provided with sewage services and water services or either of such services by the Pure Water Supply Division of the Ministry of Works, Hydraulics and Supply immediately before the commencement of this Act; and

- (b) in those other areas of Guyana which, immediately before the commencement of this Act, were not being provided with sewage services and water services or either of such services by any Statutory body,"; and
- (ii) <u>Insertion</u> of the words "or sewer" immediately after the word "main" in the fourth line of subsection (3).

Clause 6 was then passed as amended.

- <u>Clause 7</u> The following amendments by the Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply were <u>carried</u>:
 - (i) <u>Substitution</u> of the word "or" for the word "of" where it last appears in subsection 2(a); and
 - (ii) Substitution of the word "fall" for the word "fail" in subsection (4).

Cleuse 7 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 8 to 10 were passed as printed.

Clause 11 - The following amendment by the Minister of Works,
Hydraulics and Supply was carried:

Substitution of a semicolon for the comma after the word "purpose".

Clause 11 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 12 to 14 were passed as printed.

Clause 15 - The following amendment by the Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply was <u>carried</u>:

Insertion of the word ", biological" after the
word "bacteriological".

Clause 15 was then passed as amended.

Clauses 16 to 28 were passed as printed.

Clause 20 - The following amendment by the Minister of Works,
Hydraulics and Supply was carried:

Substitution of the following for Clause 29:

- " Minor amendment of the
 Municipal and
 District
 Councils Act,
 1969.
 No. 24 of 1969.
- 29. The Municipal and District Councils
 Act 1969 is hereby amended in the following respects -
 - (a) by the substitution of the words "Guyana Water Authority under the Guyana Water Authority Act 1972" for the word "Minister" where it first appears in section 282(1);

- (b) by the substitution of the words "Guyana Water Authority" for the word "Minister" where it appears for the second time in section 282(1);
- (c) by the substitution of the words "so authorised" for the words "authorised under this section" in section 282(2);
- (d) Insert the following subsection in section 283 -
 - "(4) In this and the next
 succeeding section, the
 word "council" shall not
 include a council whose
 district is supplied with
 water by or on behalf of
 the Guyana Water Authority
 in exercise of their
 functions under the
 Guyana Water Authority
 Act 1972.". "

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Works, Hydraulics and Supply, the Bill was read the third time and passed as amended.

At 8.32 p.m., on a motion by the Minister of Housing and Reconstruction (Leader of the House), the Assembly was adjourned to a date to be fixed.
