MUTIONS

ITEM 1 - MOTION TO APPROVE FINANCIAL PAPER NO. 3/1072

Assembly resolved itself into Committee of Supply to consider Financial Paper No. 3/1972.

In Committee of Sunply

In accordance with article 80(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance signified the Cabinet's recommendation and moved the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Committee of Supply approve of the proposals set out in Financial Paper No. 3/1972 - Schedule of Supplementary Provision on the Current and Capital Estimates for the period ending 25th July, 1972, totalling \$3,266,178.

The Financial Paper was under consideration when the time for the suspension of the Sitting was reached.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 4.10 p.m. the Sitting was suspended for refreshments.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 4.35 p.m. the Sitting was resumed.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee of Supply to resume consideration of Financial Paper No. 3/1972.

In Committee of Supply

On a motion by the Minister of Finance the Assembly adopted the following Resolution:

RESOLVED, That this National Assembly agree with the Committee of Supply in the following Resolution:

"RESULVED, That the Committee of Supply approve of the proposals set out in Financial Paper No. 3/1972 -Schedule of Supplementary Provision on the Current and Capital Estimates for the period ending 25th July, 1972, totalling \$3,286,178."

Agreement to sit beyond 6.30 p.m.

At 6.25 p.m. it was agreed that the sitting should not be suspended at 6.30 p.m.

ITEM Z - MOTION TO AMEND THE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The Minister of Finance moved the following motion which was put and <u>carried</u>:

WHEREAS it is necessary to amend the Development Programme of Guyana for the period 1966 to 1972, originally approved by Resolution No. LXXIV of the National Assembly of 27th April, 1966, so as to provide for additional capital expenditure under Division XVI subhead 9 Canada/Guyana Geophysical Survey, as detailed hereunder:-

> One hundred and fifty four thousand dollars (\$154,000) approximately, that is to say seventy thousand Canadian dollars, for the making of a mineral resources inventory by means of an aerial magnetic radio metric survey of Northern, North Central and Southern Guyana, including three seismic profiles over the Takutu sedimentary besin to a total of one hundred miles; and certain ground surveys related to the aerial magnetic survey, hereinbefore mentioned:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly in purusance of section 3 of the Public Loan Ordinance, 1966 approve of the amendment of the Development Programme for the period 1966 to 1972 by increasing the provision under Division XVI subhead 9 Canada/Guyana Geophysical Survey by the amount of \$154,000 for the purposes aforesaid.

ITEM 3 ITEM (0 APPROVE OF A CANADIAN GOVERNMENT LOAN OF G\$154,000

The Minister of Finance moved the following motion which was put and <u>carried</u>:

WHEREAS for the purposes of the Development Programme of Guyana for the period 1966 to 1972, the additional sum of one hundred and fifty four thousand dollars (\$154,000) approximately, that is to say, the sum of seventy thousand Canadian dollars is required for the completion of a mineral resources inventory, by means of an aerial magnetic radio metric survey of Northern, North Central and Southern Guyana including three seismic profiles over the Takutu sedimentary basin to a total of one hundred miles; and certain ground surveys related to the aerial magnetic survey hereinbefore mentioned;

AND WHEREAS it is necessary to raise a loan in the sum of seventy thousand Canadian dollars, for the purpose aforesaid ;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Canada is willing to make available a loan, in the sum aforesaid for the purpose aforesaid, free from interest, commitment or service charges and repayable in eighty instalments, each of eight hundred and seventy four Canadian dollars, approximately equivalent to one thousand eight hundred and ninety four dollars (\$1,894) Guyana, due and payable on the last day of October and the last day of February, of each year, the first instalment to be paid on the last day of October 1980 and the last instalment to be paid on the last day of February, 2020:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly in pursuance of section 4 of the Public Loan Ordinance 1966 approve of the raising from the Government of Canada of the loan aforesaid, in the sum aforesaid, for the purpose aforesaid such loan to be repaid at the times and in the manner, hereinbefore specified.

ADJOURNMENT

At 6.30 p.m., on a motion by the Minister of Housing and Reconstruction (Leader of the House), the Assembly was adjourned to a date to be fixed.
