The following amendment moved by the Financial Secreta and Treasurer was accepted:-

Substitution of a colon for the full stop at the end of the clause; and the insertion of the following proviso:-

"Provided that the provisions of this section -

- (a) shall only apply to a person who is a money lend r within the meaning o section two of the Cap.68 Money-Len ers Ordinance;
  - (b) shall not apply to a person registered as a mone -lender under the MoneyLenders Ordinance who does not enter into any 'ew money-lending transaction after the thirty-first day of December, nineteen hundred and fifty-one."

Clause 2 was passed as mended.

The Financial Secretary and Treasurer gave members the assurance that the question of amending the Money Lenders Ordinance, Chapter 68 with respect to loans on mortgages as suggested in the course of the debate, would be referred to Government for consideration.

<u>Clause 3</u> - Mr. Lee moved the i sertion of the following proviso at the end of the Clause -

"Provided that the tax in this section in sub-section (a) shall not be chargeable in the rural areas of this Colony."
