INTRODUCTION OF BILLS

(i) The Chief Secretary gave notice of the introduction and first reading of the following Bill:

(ii) The Chief Secretary on behalf of the Member for Labour, Health and Housing, gave notice of the introduction and fir t reading of the following Bill:

ANIMALS (CONTROL OF EXPERIMENTS) BILL, 1957. (Bill No. 21/1957 p blished 15.6.57).

PUBLIC BUSINESS ORDER OF THE DAY

BILLS - First Reading.

(i) REFRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1957 - Bill No. 23/1957.

The BILL intituled AN ORD NANCE TO AMEND THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ORDINANCE AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE INCLUSION OF CERTAIN AREAS AS REGISTRATION AREAS FOR THE PURPOSES OF THAT ORDINANCE was read a list time.

(ii) ANIMALS CONTROL OF EXPER MENTS) BILL 1957 - Bill No. 21/1957.

The BILL intituled AN ORD NANCE TO REGULATE THE PRACTICE OF EXPERIMENTS ON LIVING ANIMALS, AND MATTERS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH was read a first time.

BILL - Withdrawal.

Item 1 - LOCAL GOVERNMENT AMENDMENT NO. 3) BILL, 1956. - Bill No. 56/1956.

The Member for Local Government, Social Welfare and Co-operative Development informed the Speaker that in terms of Standing Order No. 55(1), he had received instructions to withdraw the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE.

Accordingly, the Bill was wit drawn.

BILL - Committee.

Item 2 - PAWNBROKING (AMENDMENT) BI , 1957 - BILL No. 14/1957.

On a motion by the Financial Secretary seconded by the Member for Agriculture, Forests, La ds and Mines, Council resolved itself into a Committee to resume consideration of the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO MEND THE PAWNBROKING ORDINANCE.

In Committee

Clause 8 - was re-committed and he following new clause substituted therefor:

"Repeal and reenactment of section 16 of Cap. 336. 8. Section 16 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor -

'Surplus balances from sales of pledges to be paid to Public Trustee.

16. (1) Where any pledge whi h has been pawned for above five dollars is sold for more than the amount of the loan and profit and charge for insurance due at the time of sale, the pawn-bro er shall pay the surplus to he Public Trustee on behalf of the pawner not lat than two months after the date of sale:

Provided that if at any time before it is paid to the Public Trustee the holder of a pawnticket demands the surplus, the pawnbroker shall pay it to him on delivery of the pawnticket.

- (2) The Public Trustee shall, not later than three months after the receipt of any surplus balances under the provisions of subsection (1) of this section, publish in one daily newspaper circula ing in the Colony a list of the names of the persons on behalf of whom he is holding surplus balances under the provisions of subsection (1) of this section.
- (3) Where upon the application of any person, the Public Trustee is satisfied that such person is the pawner of an article in respect of which the Public Trustee is holding any surplus balance, the Public Trustee shall pay such surplus balance to such person.

- (4) T e Public Trustee shall pry into the general revenue of the Colory any surplus balances in his p ssession for more than three years.
- (5) The Public Trustee shall keep copies of the lists published under the provisions of subsection (2) of this section, and such lists shall be open to inspection by any person whose name appears thereon.
- (6) The provisions of subsections (1) and (2) of section

 Cap. 48 13 of the Public Trustees Ordinance
 shall not apply to the Public
 Trustee in regard to the duties
 under this section.' "

Clause 8 as substituted was passed.

The <u>First Schedule</u> as substituted was re-committed and was amended as under and passed:-

In the conditions to be printed on Form 2, Pawn-Ticket B, and Form 4, Special Contract, the words and commas ", unless claimed from the pawnbroker," were inserted between the words "Any surplus produced by the sale shall" and the words "be paid to the Public Tru tee".

Title and Enacting Clause - were passed as printed.

Council resumed.

At this stage further consider tion was deferred.

BILL - Second Reading.

Item 3 - ELECTRICITY BILL, 1957 - Bill No. 20/1957.

On a motion by the Member for Communications and Works seconded by the Member for Local Gov, rnment, Social Welfare and Co-operative Development, the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CORPORATION TO BE KNOWN AS THE BRITISH GUIANA ELECTRICITY CORPORATION AND FOR THE EXERCISE AND PERFORMANCE BY THE CORPORATION OF FUNCTIONS RELATING TO THE SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY AND CERTAIN OTHER MATTERS was read a second time and was thereafter taken through the Committee stage and passed with the following amendment:-

Clause 6 - Sub-clause (5):

The word "be" was inserted between the word "shall" and the word "notified" in the last line of the sub-clause.

At this stage further considers tion was deferred.

<u>Item 5</u> - MR. LUCKHOO'S MOTIOU CONCERNING THE RICE FARMERS (SECURIEY OF TENURE) ORDINANCE, 1956 (No. 31).

That this Honourable Council recommends to Government that a C mmittee be appointed immediately to enquire into the operation of the Rice Farmers (Secu ity of Tenure) Ordinance, 1956 (No. 31), and report upon the working of the said Ordinance and its effect on tenants and landlords.

Mr. Luckhoo moved and Mr. Sugrim Singh seconded the motion as amended.
