A BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE.

MOTIONSItem 1 - MOTION TO CONFIRM ORDER IN COUNCIL NO. 30 OF 1960.

On a motion by the Financial Secretary seconded by the Minister of Trade and Industry, Council adopted the following Resolution:

RESOLVED, That this Council in terms of section 9 of the Customs Ordinance, Chapter 309, confirms Order in Council No. 30 of 1960, which was made on the 8th day of March, 1960, and published in the Gazette on the 26th of March, 1960.

Item 2 - MR. BOWMAN'S MOTION CONCERNING THE GRANTING OF FREEHOLD TITLES ON A HIRE-PURCHASE BASIS..

Council resumed the debate on the following motion:

WHEREAS the social and economic system which prevails in British Guiana is patterned on that of the Western World, India and Pakistan and provides for free enterprise and the ownership of property;

AND WHEREAS the policy of the Majority Party of the Government is opposed to freehold ownership of land:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Council urges upon the Government that freehold title on a reasonable hire-purchase basis be granted to -

(i) farmers in respect of land they now occupy in Government Land Settlement Schemes; and

(ii) persons occupying Crown Lands for farming.

On a motion by Mr. Bowman seconded by Mr. Fredericks, an extension of half an hour was granted to Mr. Tello to speak to the motion.

Mr. Tello concluded his speech.

Mr. Hubbard, Mr. Campbell, Mr. Ajodha Singh, Mr. Rai and Mr. Davis spoke to the motion.

Mr. Benn then spoke to the motion, and on a motion by the Minister of Trade and Industry seconded by Mr. Ajodha Singh, was granted an extension of half an hour.

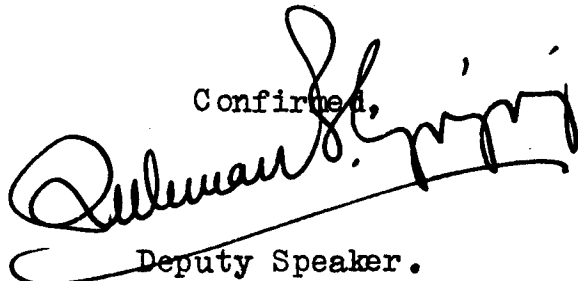
At 4.50 p.m. Mr. Benn concluded his speech.
