ORAL ASKING AND ANSWERING OF QUESTIONS

Question No. 30

Mr. Tello asked the Minister of Labour, Health and Housing the following question:

QUESTION: When will the recommendations contained in the Watchmen's Ad Hoc Advisory Committee's Report, which was tabled in the Legislative Council since March, 1959, be implemented?

The <u>Minister of Labour, Health and Housing</u> gave the following reply:

ANSWER: The full and immediate implementation of the recommendations of the Watchmen's Ad Hoc Advisory Committee presented such practical difficulties that the Government had to reexamine the matter. That re-examination is nearly completed.

BILL - Second and Third Readings.

Item 1 - PHARMACY AND POISONS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1960 - Bill No. 16/1960.

On a motion by the Minister of Labour, Health and Housing seconded by the Minister of Communications and Works the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE PHARMACY AND POISONS ORDINANCE, 1956, was read the second time.

Council then resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

Clause 2 - Mr. Burnham moved that Council do report progress and ask leave to sit again.

The question was put and negatived.

Thereafter, Clause 2 was passed as printed.

Clauses 3 to 16 - were passed as printed.

Thereafter, on a motion by the Minister of Labour, Health and Housing the Bill was read the third time and passed as printed.
