#### ORAL ASKING AND ANSWERING OF QUESTIONS

# Question No. 5

 $\underline{\text{Mr. Bowman}}$  asked the Minister of Community Development and  $\overline{\text{Education}}$  the following question:

QUESTION: Will the Minister of Community Development and Education tell this Council how much money, if any, was spent by Government from Colonial Development and Welfare grants for building and repairing schools in the Colony, from the time the Colony started to receive Colonial Development and Welfare grants, and how much was spent from the revenue of the Colony for the same purpose over the same period?

The <u>Minister of Community Development and Education</u> gave the following reply:

ANSWER: The sum of \$1,668,424.36 was spent from Colonial Development and Welfare funds during the period 1945-1959 for the building of primary schools. During the same period the Government spent out of local funds the sum of \$2,019,784.41 for the building and maintenance of Primary Schools. This latter figure does not include the amount spent by the Government out of local funds for the maintenance of Government-owned and Government-controlled schools.
