PERSONAL EXPLANATIONS

Inaccurate Press Report

The Minister of Community Development and Education was granted leave to refer to a report in that day's issue of the Daily Chronicle on his remarks in Council the previous day on the Education (Amendment) Bill.

Mr. Rai expressed the view that the report was not only inaccurate, but also inadequate and unfair. He pointed out that the statement "Slavery was not incompatible with Christianity", attributed to him by the press, was, in fact, a quotation from the Reverend Mortier, a leading Methodist Missionary. Also he was reported to have said "the Church was not to resist civil authority but to obey on several matters", while what he did say was "the Church must obey the State on secular matters".

 - (b) Addition of the letter"s" to the word "school" in the fifth line.
 - (c) <u>Substitution</u> of the word "continue" for the word "cease" in the sixth line.
 - (d) <u>Deletion</u> of the word "an" in the seventh line, and addition of the letter "s" to the word "school" in the same line.
 - (e) <u>Deletion</u> of all of the words in the subsection following the word "school" in the seventh line, and <u>substitution</u> therefor of the following:

"and that Schools Control Committees be established to govern and control all denominational schools on the basis of three representatives from each denomination and two from Government."

The <u>Chairman</u> ruled that the amendments could not be accepted for the reason that they were opposed to the principles of the Bill.

(ii) <u>Mr. Tello</u> moved the following amendment to the new section 32A(1):-

> Substitution of the words "twelve months" for the words "one month" in the third line thereof.

After discussion, the amendment was put and <u>negatived</u> on the following division:-
