MOTIONS

Item 1 - MOTION CONCERNING THE REVISION OF SALARIES IN THE PUBLIC SERVICE.

The Assembly resumed consideration of the following motion and amendments:

MOTION -

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Legislative Assembly approves of the payment of salaries to Public Servants with effect from 1st January, 1961, at the rates set out in the Report of the Commission to Review Wages, Salaries and Conditions of Service in the Public Service, British Guiana, 1961, as modified by the Government in Sessional Paper No. 3 of 1962 pending final consideration in the light of the decisions arising from discussion in Whitley Council;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That in terms of section 18 of the Financial

Administration and Audit Ordinance, 1961 (No. 39), this Legislative Assembly authorises the expenditure of \$2,600,000 required to meet the payment of arrears of salaries on the aforementioned basis in respect of the year 1961.

AMENDMENTS - moved at the previous sitting on Thursday, st March, 1962.

1. By Mr. d'Aguiar:

- (i) <u>Delete</u> in the first resolve clause the words "as modified by the Government in Sessional Paper No. 3 of 1962".
- (ii) <u>Insert</u> as a third resolve clause -

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That this Assembly recommends that the minimum basic daily wage for unclassified Government workers be increased from \$3.04 per day to \$3.64 per day with corresponding increases for all unclassified Government workers.

2. By Mr. Jordan:

Second resolve clause:

Substitute - a comma for the full stop at the end of the second resolve clause and add the words "and such additional funds as may be necessary."

Third resolve clause proposed by Mr. d'Aguiar:

Substitute - "\$4.00" for the figures "\$3.64" in the third resolve clause moved by Mr. d'Aguiar.

3. By the Premier:

Substitution - of a comma for the full stop at the end of the third resolve clause as moved by Mr. d'Aguiar, including the amendment moved by Mr. Jordan, and addition of the words "subject to funds being available."

Mr. d'Aguiar, with the leave of his seconder, indicated his acceptance of Mr. Jordan's amendment for the substitution of the figures "\$4.00" for "\$3.64" in the third resolve clause.

Mr. Burnham, Mr. Mann, Mr. Kendall, Mr. Bissember and Mr. Benn spoke.

AND FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Assembly recommends that the minimum basic daily wage for unclassified Government workers be increased from \$3.04 per day to \$4.00 per day with corresponding increases for all unclassified Government workers, subject to funds being available.

- MOTION AUTHORISING EXPENDITURE FOR THE PURCHASE AND ALTERATION OF PREMISES AT SELOT 21 BRICKDAM, GEORGETOWN.

On a motion by the Minister of Finance, the Assembly adopted the following Resolution:-

RESOLVED, That this Legislative Assembly authorises the expenditure of \$81,000 for the purchase and alteration of premises situate at $S^{\frac{1}{2}}$ Lot 21 Brickdam, Georgetown, to accommodate the Ministry of Education and Social Development.

In terms of Standing Order 21, the Governor's recommendation, as signified by the Minister, was laid over.
