INTRODUCTION OF BILL - First Reading.

INCOME TAX (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1962. (L.A. Bill No. 11/1962 published 2.5.62).

The <u>Minister of Finance</u>, on behalf of the Government, presented the following Bill:

A BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE INCOME TAX ORDINANCE.

The Bill was read the first time.

Ruling by His Honour the Deputy Speaker re Motion to approve One-sixth of expenditure provision of Interim Estimates of Expenditure laid on 30th April, 1962.

His Honour the Deputy Speaker referred to the point of order raised by Mr. Carter under Standing Orders Nos. 21 and 37 at the previous sitting on Monday, 30th April, questioning the right of the House to consider a motion by the Minister of Finance seeking authority for expenditure amounting to \$9,391,743:- against the Interim Estimates of Expenditure for 1962.

His Honour ruled that the points raised were without merit and that the motion would be proceeded with.

Mr. Bissember then referred to the requirement of Article 109(4)(a)(ii) of the British Guiana Constitution and raised a further objection which was also overruled by the Deputy Speaker.

Thereafter, Members constituting the Minority, bowed to the Chair and left the Chamber.

MOTION

item 1 - MOTION TO APPROVE ONE-SIXTH OF THE EXPENDITURE PROVISION OF THE ESTIMATES OF EXPENDITURE.

Assembly resumed consideration of the following motion:-

WHEREAS article 109(4)(b) of the Constitution limits to four months ending 30th April the period during which public funds may be expended in pursuance of the provisions of the Financial Administration and Audit Ordinance, 1961, in anticipation of the passage of the appropriation law; and

WHEREAS the appropriation law for the year 1962 will not be passed before the expiry of the said period and it is necessary to provide for expenditure on the public services pending the passage of this law:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Legislative Assembly approves in accordance with Article 109(4)(a)(ii) of the Constitution one-sixth of the expenditure provision proposed under each of the subheads of the Estimates of Expenditure which have been laid on the Table, to a total of nine million, three hundred and minety-one thousand, seven hundred and forty-three dollars as detailed by heads in the undermentioned Schedule.
