<u>Item 1</u> - MOTION TO APPROVE PAYMENT OF SIONS AT REVISED RATES. In terms of Standing Order No. 21, he Minister of Finance

laid over the Governor's recommendation

On a motion by the Minister of Fina following Resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, That the Legislature pproves of the payment of additional cost-of-livin allowances with effect from 1st January, 1961, to s pplement those now in force, to Government pension rs (including teachers), who retired prior to 1st January, 1961, and to Widows' and Orphans' pension rs who were awarded pensions based on pre-1961 ontributions, as follows:

(i)

Cost-of-living allowances at equal to the difference between the c rent pension and the pension payable on th equivalent revised salary at 1st January 1961.

- (ii) <u>To all other pensioners</u> (including Widows[†] and Orphans[†] pensioners)
 - (a) 10% of "gross" pension (b sic and cost-of-living allowance, if any) on "gross" pensions not e ceeding \$1,200 per annum.
 - (b) \$120 per annum on "gross" pensions (basic plus cost-of-liv allowance, if any) exceeding \$1,200 er annum;

AND FURTHER RESOLVED, That the idows' and Orphans' pensions awarded <u>after</u> 1st January, 1954, but based on pre-1954 contributions, he increase by a cost-ofliving allowance so as to bring the gross pensions payable from 1st January, 1961, in ine with gross pensions based on the same contribu ions but awarded before 1st January, 1954.
