# MOTIONS

### Item 1 - MOTION TO APPROVE REFUND O STAMP DUTY.

On a motion by Senator Khan, se onded by Senator Thomas, the Senate adopted the following Re olution:

RESOLVED, That the Legisla ure approves of the remission of the stamp duty of ne hundred dollars paid by the Association of Bapt st Churches in British Guiana in terms of section 9(33 of the Tax Ordinance, Chapter 298.

# DEFENCE BILL, 1962 - Bill No. 22 19 2 L.A.

The relevant Standing Orders we e suspended to enable the Senate to proceed with the remaini stages of the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE FR VISION FOR THE DEFENCE OF BRITISH GUIANA BY THE ESTABLISHMEN OF A BRITISH GUIANA ARMY AND OTHER UNITS OF HER MAJESTY'S MILITARY FORCES, AND TO PROVIDE FOR MATTERS CONNECTED THE ITH AND INCIDENTAL THERETO.

On a motion by the Minister of Trade and Industry, the Bill was read a second time and was thereafter taken through its remaining stages and passed with the following amendments in Committee:-

<u>Clause 6</u> - <u>Substituted</u>: The wo ds "The Governor may establish and maintain" for the words 'There shall be established and maintained" in subsection (1).

- <u>Clause 7</u> <u>Substituted</u>: The word 'may" for the word "shall" after the words "The Governor" in the first line of subsection (1).
- <u>Clause ll</u> <u>Substituted</u>: The word may" for the word "shall" after the words "Army Council" in the first line.
- <u>Clause 74</u> <u>Substituted</u>: The words "a term not exceeding fifteen y ars" for the words "any term" at he end of the clause.
- <u>Clause 98</u> <u>Substituted:</u> The words "in British Guiana" for the words "in England" -
  - (i) aft r the words "in civil co ts" in the third line of subsection (1);
  - (ii) aft r the words "civil court"
     in the sixth line of sub section (1);
  - (iii) after the words "civil court" in the last line of subsection (3).
- <u>Clause 99</u> <u>Substituted</u>: The words "Supreme Court of British Guiana" f r the words "High Court of Justic in England".

FIRE BRIGADE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1962 - Bill No. 25/1962 (S).

The relevant Standing Orders were suspended to enable the Senate to proceed with the remaining tages of the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE F E BRIGADE ORDINANCE, 1957.

On a motion by the Minister of Education and Social Development the Bill was read a second time nd was thereafter taken through its remaining stages and pass d as printed.

### PUBLIC CORPORATIONS BILL, 1962 - Bill No. 24/1962 (L.A.)

The relevant Standing Orders were suspended to enable the Senate to proceed with the remaining tages of the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF PUBLIC CORPORATIONS AND FOR PURPOSES ONNECTED THEREWITH.

On a motion by the Minister of Trade and Industry, the Bill was read a second time.

Thereafter the Senate resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

Clauses 1 and 2 - were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 3</u> - <u>Senator Tasker</u> moved the following amendments which were put and negatived: <u>Substitution</u> of the word "five" for the word "three" in the second line of subsection (5); Clause 3 was then passed as printed.

Clauses 4 to 9 - were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 10</u> - <u>Senator Tasker</u> moved he following amendment which was put and <u>e tived</u>:

Deletion of the viso.

Clause 10 was then printed.

<u>Clause 11</u> - <u>Senator Tasker</u> moved the following amendment which was put and ne <u>atived</u>:

> Deletion of the word "with the approval of a Minister," in the f rst line.

Clause 11 was then p ssed as printed.

Clauses 12 to 45 - were passed a printed.

<u>Clause 46</u> - <u>Senator Tasker</u> moved the following amendment which was put and <u>ne atived</u>:

> Insertion of the wors "approval by resolution of the Legislative Assembly" after the word "order" in the sec nd line of subsection (1).

- Clause 46 was then ssed as printed.
- Clauses 47 to 53 were passed printed.
