QUESTIONS TO MINISTERS

Question No. 44

<u>Mr. Wharton</u> asked the Minister of Labour, Health and Housing the following question:

QUESTION: When does Government propose to undertake the laying of the pipes along the East sideline dam to serve the Mortuary and the Health Centre at Lichfield, West Coast, Berbice?

The <u>Minister of Labour</u>, <u>Health and Housing</u> gave the following reply:

ANSWER: The laying of pipes along the East sideline dam to serve the Health Centre at Lichfield, West Coast, Berbice, is now in progress. It is considered uneconomical to extend the line to the Mortuary which is only used occasionally. Instead, it is proposed to erect storage drums to collect rain water from the roof.

Question No. 45

<u>Mr. Wharton</u> asked the Minister of Works and Hydraulics the following question:

QUESTION: Are excess commodities during such periods when there is over-production of fish, fruits, greens and vegetables made available to the hospitals, prisons and other such institutions?

The <u>Minister of Works and Hydraulics</u> gave the following reply:

ANSWER: No, Sir. Hospitals, prisons and other such institutions either purchase their normal requirement from the Government Marketing Division or produce their own. In periods of glut surpluses appear after the needs of institutions have been met. In the case of milk, it is sometimes possible that some institutions can use more than they normally require and in such cases surpluses are made available without charge.

 $\underline{Mr. Rai}$ asked the Minister of Finance the following question:

QUESTION: Will the Minister of Finance say what fees and costs, if any, have been received by the Attorney-General in respect of litigation to which the Government was a party or an interested party, since September, 1961?

MOTION TO APPROVE FINANCIAL PAPER NO. 6/1962.

DEFENCE BILL, 1962 - Bill No. 22/1962 (L.A.) - SENATE AMENDMENTS.

On a motion by the Acting Premier, Assembly agreed to consider the Senate amendments to the Defence Bill, 1962, forthwith.

The amendments as follows were then read:

- <u>Clause 6</u> <u>Substituted:</u> The words "The Governor may establish and maintain" for the words "There shall be established and maintained" in subsection (1).
- <u>Clause 7</u> <u>Substituted</u>: The word "may" for the word "shall" after the words "The Governor" in the first line of subsection (1).
- Clause 11 Substituted: The word "may" for the word "shall" after the words "Army Council" in the first line.
- <u>Clause 74</u> <u>Substituted:</u> The words "a term not exceeding fifteen years" for the words "any term" at the end of the clause.
- Clause 92 Substituted: The words "in British Guiana" for the words "in England" -
 - (i) after the words "in civil courts" in the third line of subsection (1);
 - (ii) after the words "civil court" in the sixth line of subsection (1);
 - (iii) after the words "civil court" in the last line of subsection (3).
- <u>Clause 99</u> <u>Substituted</u>: The words "Supreme Court of British Guiana" for the words "High Court of Justice in England".

On a motion by the Acting Premier, Assembly agreed with the Senate amendments.

Item 2 on Order Paper

FIRE BRIGADE (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1962 - Bill No. 25/1962 (S) - Second and Third Readings.

On a motion by the Minister of Labour, Health and Housing the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE FIRE BRIGADE ORDINANCE, 1957, was read a second time and was thereafter taken through its remaining stages and passed as printed.

MOTION TO REFUND STAMP DUTY ON PRIVATE BILL.

On a motion by Mr. Robertson, seconded by Mr. Downer, the following Resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, That the Legislature approves of the remission of the stamp duty of one hundred dollars paid by the Association of Baptist Churches in British Guiana in terms of section 9(33) of the Tax Ordinance, Chapter 298.

MOTION TO EXTEND COMMISSIONER OF TITLE (ADDITIONAL POWERS) ORDINANCE, 1960.

On a motion by the Minister of Labour, Health and Housing, the following Resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED, That the Commissioner of Title (Additional Powers) Ordinance, 1960, shall continue in force for a period of one year up to and including the 4th day of November, 1963.
