At this stage the Minister of Finance was granted leave to move a suspension of the Standing Orders to enable him to proceed with a motion deprecating the irresponsible attitude of the Daily Chronicle in publishing a false report in that day's issue.

With the leave of the Speaker, and on a motion by the Minister of Finance, the Standing Orders were suspended.

The Minister then moved the following motion:

WHEREAS there was published in today's issue of the Daily Chronicle a report that the delivery of more than 250 firearms consigned to a local trading company was stalled by Security Police:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Legislative A sembly deprecates the irresponsible attitude of the Daily Chronicle in continuing to publish false reports, thereby creating an atmosphere detrimental to the national interest.

Mr. d'Aguiar, Mr. Mann and Mr. Wilson spoke to the motion.

Mr. Burnham moved the following amendment:

Deletion of the words "continuing to publish false reports" and

Substitution therefor of the words "publishing the aforesaid false report".

The Premier spoke to the motion.

The Minister of Finance replied and accepted the amendment.
