BILL - Second Reading.

Item 1 - APPROFRICATION BILL, 1962 - Bill No. 30/1962 (L.A.)

On a motion by the Attorney-General the BILL intituled AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE SUMMARY JURISDICTION (PROCEDURE) ORDINANCE was read a second time and was thereafter taken through its remaining stages and passed as printed.

Item 3 - MOTION BE FLAG, COAT OF ARMS, NATIONAL ANTHEM, ETC. FOR AN INDEPENDENT BRITISH GUIANA.

On a motion by the Minister of Agriculture, Forests and Lands, the following Resolution was adopted:

RESOLVED. That this Legislative Assembly authorises the appointment of a Special Select Cormittee of this Assembly charged with the responsibility for -

- (a) designing a nation 1 flag and a coat of arms;
- (b) composing a national anthem; and
- (c) recommending an appropriate name for a politically free and independent Emitish Guiana.
