WHEREAS on the 8th day of May, 1963, Proclamation No. 2 of 1963 was made by the Governor declari a public emergency for the purposes of article 14 of the Constitution of British Guiana:

AND WHEREAS the said Proclamation was laid before both Chambers of the Legislature in pursuance f the provisions of sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (3) of the said article:

AND WHEREAS the said Proclamation shall be of effect for fourteen days beginning on the 8th day of May, 1963, in terms of paragraph (b) of the said article unless the Legislature resolves that it shall be of effect for a further period not exceeding three months from the date on which it would otherwise expire:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That Proclamation No. 2 of 1963 made on the 8th day of May, 1963, do continue i force until the 15th day of August, 1963, unless sooner revoked.
