In Committee

Clause 1 was passed as amended.

Clause 2

Mr. Raphael Trotman moved the following amendments which were put and carried:

"Delete the numbers and letter "119D" and replace them with 119D(1) immediately after Clause 2 the words:

11.

Insert after the Clause 119D(1) a new Clause 119D(2) to read as follows:

'To assist it in its work, the committee shall have the power to co-opt experts or enlist the aid of other persons of appropriate expertise, whether or not such experts or persons are members of the National Assembly.'"

Mr. Robert Corbin moved the following amendments which were put and negatived:

Article 119D to be renumbered '119D(1)'.

In line 4 of 119D, after the word 'for', delete the words 'examining the policies' and replace with the words 'the scrutiny of all areas of Government policy'.

In line 5, after the comma, delete the word 'namely' and replace with the words 'including the entities in'.

The amended Article 119D(1) would, accordingly, read:

119D(1). There shall be a Standing Committee of the National Assembly to be named the Parliamentary Oversight Committee on the Security Sector and it shall have responsibility for the scrutiny of all areas of Government policy and administration of the entities in the Security sector, including the entities in the Disciplined Forces of Guyana.

Insert a new Article 119D(2):

119D(2). The Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson of the Parliamentary Oversight Committee on the Security Sector shall be elected from the opposite sides of the National Assembly and shall not be a Government Minister."

Clause 2 was then passed as amended.

Assembly resumed

On a motion by the Attorney General and Minister of Legal Affairs, the Constitution (Amendment) Bill 2009 was read a third time and <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u>.
