Reply submitted by the Minister of Local Government and Regional Development:

The Guyana Airways Corporation is no longer in existence. As a consequence, I am not in a position to say if by way of a Government Policy any subsidy to cost was implemented for goods transported to North Pakaraimas via Guyana Airways Corporation (G.A.C.).

I am aware of:

- (a) Persons being referred to Georgetown for medical treatment and their passage (return) and stay while in Georgetown are borne by the State.
- (b) Secondary school scholarship students are brought out to Georgetown and returned to their homes at the beginning and ending of each school term with their expenses paid for by the State.
- (c) Scholarship students are given a stipend and are provided with board/lodge at the State's expense.
- (d) Detail of the numbers of scholarship students from the various location are available at the Amerindian Affairs Ministry.

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly recognises the need for a policy to be crafted and appropriate regulation instituted in consultation with operators in the sector, consumers and other stakeholders to introduce best practices and systems for the safe, efficient and fair operation of the sector.
