Mrs. Sheila Holder asked the Minister of Foreign Affairs the following question:

*Would the Minister of Foreign Affairs say when the Government of Guyana lodged instruments of ratification with the International Criminal Court of Justice?

Oral reply received from Minister of Foreign Affairs:

The Government of Guyana has not yet lodged any instruments of ratification with the International Criminal Court.

The Government signed the Rome Statute establishing the International Criminal Court on December 28, 2000; however the Statute has not yet been ratified.

A Parliamentary Motion has been submitted for ratification of the said convention, after which the appropriate instruments will be laid.

2. SUGAR INDUSTRY LABOUR WELFARE FUND

Mr. Khemraj Ramjattan asked the Minister of Labour, Human services and Social Security the following questions:

Could the Minister -

- (ii) State the amount of moneys disbursed by the Treasury from the Sugar Industry Labour Welfare Fund for each of the years for the period 1994 to 2003?
- (iii) State whether the Sugar Industry Labour Welfare Fund is indebted to the Guyana Sugar Corporation and, if so, the amount of the debt at the end of 2003?
- (iv) State whether Committees for the Sugar Industry Labour Price Stabilisation Fund and the Sugar Industry Rehabilitation Fund were appointed and, if not, why not? If not appointed can the Honourable Minister say when these Committees were last appointed?

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- (iii) Yes. The amount owing to GUYSUCO is \$97,056,804.51. This amount represents expenditure incurred by GUYSUCO on behalf of the SILWF for security, fuel, etc., for operating the SILWF'S pure water supply system.
- (iv) The Committee have not been appointed. They were last appointed in the 1980s. The sums allocated under the Special Funds Act have been so minuscule that it seemed pointless to establish the Committees.

ITEM 1 RATIFICATION OF THE ROME STATUTE OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL COURT CRIMINAL COURT

The Minister of Foreign Affairs moved the following motion:

WHEREAS the Rome Statute for the establishment of the International Criminal Court was adopted in Rome on July 17, 1998 and entered into force on June 1, 2003 in accordance with the provisions of Article 126;

AND WHEREAS the Statute was signed by the Permanent Representative of Guyana to the United Nations on behalf of the Government of the Republic of Guyana on December 28, 2000;

AND WHEREAS Article 125 of the said Statute makes provision for the deposit of the instruments of Ratification with the Secretary General of the United Nations.

NOW THEREFORE the Government of the Republic of Guyana having considered the Statute hereby confirms and ratifies the same and undertakes faithfully to perform and carry out all the stipulations therein.

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RESOLVED,

That this National Assembly agrees to the Secretary General of the United Nations being informed of Guyana's intention to ratify the said Rome Statute of the International Criminal Court and for the Government of Guyana to formally ratify the said Statute by depositing the Instrument of Ratification.
