# **ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE SPEAKER**

#### Seat of Mr. Raphael Trotman, M.P.

The Speaker, as promised at the sitting of the National Assembly on the 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2005 reported on the letter that he had received from the Leader of the Opposition requesting that the seat of the Hon. Member Mr. Raphael Trotman, M.P., be declared vacant pursuant to Article 156 (3) of the Constitution.

The Speaker stated that according to Articles 64, 156 (2) and (3) and 163 that it was clear that only the High Court has jurisdiction not only in relation to questions as to membership of the National Assembly but in relation to whether any member is required to cease to exercise functions by virtue of Article 156 (3) on which Mr. Corbin was relying and that the jurisdiction of the Court is exclusive.

The Speaker further stated that in the circumstances he had no power to make the declaration sought by Mr. Corbin.
