APPENDIX

Answers to Questions from Mr. Ronald Bulkan, M.P., to the Minister of Health:

(i) This statement made by the Honourable Member Mr. R Bulkan, M.P. is very much inaccurate and uninformed, since the matter was in the first instance reported by the Regional Health Officer (RHO) who is stationed at Bartica and immediate action was taken by the Ministry of Health (MOH) to deploy an emergency response team to Waramondong. This immediate response started with a telephone call by the Minister to Commodore Bess aimed at mobilizing the airlift capacity of the GDF Air Wing and its Medical personnel in a joint emergency response with the local Regional Health Sector workers and the National Malaria Control Services. The RHO of Region 7 was informed of the suspected outbreak of Malaria in the Waramadong School and Dormitory by the Regional Education Officer based in Bartica. The Head Mistress of that Institution had communicated the information about a suspected outbreak to the Regional Education Officer. The Director of the Regional Health Services Programme (Programme 4 of the MOH) was also informed of the evolving situation and took the most active part in the roll out of subsequent stages and components of the response activity. The Regional Health Services Programme (Programme 4) is charged with specific national responsibilities which each year are reaffirmed in the Budget and financed through the provisions of the said budget. The relevant sections can be perused in the Volume 2 of the ESTIMATES of the PUBLIC SECTOR under Programme 474 – Regional and Clinical Services.

Noting the significance of Malaria in our country the Minister invoked the War Room in his Office and placed on alert all the relevant officers with meetings key senior MOH personnel on a daily basis to keep abreast with the situation on the ground.

During that period the Ministry was in constant contact with the medical personnel in Bartica, giving updates on the immediate plans that were being put in place to address the perceived emergency. In the very initial stages of these arrangements a stopover in Bartica by the GDF Sky Van was contemplated. This would have allowed the pick-up of the RHO and possibly additional health care providers to join the local workers already in Waramadong. This diversion which would have taken time and reduced cargo capacity for more critically anti-malaria supplies and equipment was discarded since the team from Georgetown was among the best and headed by the Director of the National Malaria Services himself. The cargo capacity that would have been lost to accommodating Health care providers from Bartica was instead used for the airlift of insecticides, treated bed-nets and spray cans. This decision was communicated with the RHO who saw the wisdom in it and supported it.

In keeping with good administrative protocols and practices, it is expected that the RHO reported to the REO who would then have apprised or adequately informed the Regional Chairman. The RHO and the MOH were in constant contact as the emergency response progressed. The RHO of Region 7 is one of the most experienced and long-serving among Regional Health Officers and is one of the best over the past decade. The Regional Executive Officer of Region 7 has unreserved confidence in the RHO and these two senior Regional Democratic Council Officers work and collaborate professionally.

The Ministry of Health brings to the attention of Parliament and the Nation the swift and effective response of Commodore Bess and the GDF Air Wing. This was a highly successful joint activity. This is an excellent example of the various elements of the Government of Guyana working together to achieve the benefits of synergies, optimal use of the tax payers' dollar and delivery of services.

The Ministry of Health wishes to recognize the contribution of GDF pilots Captain Patrick Nicholas and Captain Azeez Nizamudeen.

The Ministry of Health also wishes to recognize the effective and professional support given by *Medex Chavez Edwards* who led the local Mazaruni health care provider component of the joint emergency response team.

The emergency response team discovered a very small number of children with Malaria at the School and treated these. There are over 900 children enrolled at the School and living at the Waramadong Dormitory. Only 13 were found to be infected with Malaria. These students hail from four surrounding Amerindian Villages. The children had returned to School from various Amerindian Villages following the Christmas Holidays and had most likely been infected in their respective home communities. That is to say there was no outbreak at the School or Dormitory.

The emergency response team executed microscopy investigations, did mass screening, treated those ill with malaria and distributes health literacy material. The team also conducted training in the safe and effective use of spray cans and the insecticide used in the spraying exercises. The training benefited the Toshao and leading residents of the Community. The team conducted spraying exercises along with the recently trained residents. The Team donated to the Village Council spray cans and insecticide. The MOH committed to a return visit.

This return visit was started over the over the past week-end by four persons from Georgetown and their efforts will be strengthened by the addition of seven more persons from Georgetown during the current week. Extended training of two persons from each of the communities from where the infected students hail and from other communities will be done in use of spray can and chemicals and other anti-malaria work.

This response effort demonstrated the capacity of the Central Ministry through its Programme 4 to effectively execute its mandate to assist in the provision of specialist health care services to any Region(s) of the country this is deemed necessary; and to support the regional health service in provision of quality care for the residents.

I posit that the real reason for this question the discomfort Mr. Bulkan experiences when he recognizes the swiftness of the effective

response and the positive impact it has created among the leaders and residents of the Mazaruni Amerindian Communities, the hard working senior Officers of Region 10 and the health care providers of that Region.

Yes, Mr. Bulkan the Government of Guyana, including its Ministry of Health, intend to continue to execute its legitimate mandate in this swift, effective, efficient and sustainable manner
