(ii) Abuse of Privilene of Speech by Members, and Publication by Media af Certain Pemarks made by Members

The Speaker made the following statement:-

"Honourable Members, during the debate on the Budget there were occasions when a few Hon. Members' speeches contained clear incitement to racial hostility and also clear imputations of improper conduct on the part of the Hon. Senior Minister of Finance and other Hon. Ministers.

I do not think I have any power under the Standing Orders to prevent inflammatory remarks which are designed to incite hostility or ill will against any section of the Public and which are contrary to the provisions of the Racial Hostility Act, Chapter 23:01. I have, however, power to request an Hon. Member to withdraw improper imputations, to request an apology and to have affective remarks expunded from the record of the proceedings.

I did not however exercise the pawer I have during the Dudget debate because my intervention would have highlighted the Hon. Members' remarks which I knew would have been published in the media.

Hon. Members, the Bill of Fights 1688 provides that "the freedom of speech and debates or proceedings in Parliament quant not to be impeached or questioned in any court or place out of Parliament." As a result

statements in Parliament are absolutely privileged.

This August House also enjoys a similar privilege, that is, "what is said and done within its wells cannot be inquired into in a Court of Law."

Because of this immunity Hon. Members cannot be sued or prosecuted for anything said in Parliament. A Member can, therefore, because of this privilege breach a law such as Pacial Hostility Act or falsely and maliciously impute improper conduct against other Hon. Members and/or members of the public. Such conduct can incite hatred, contempt or ridicule against other Members and/or persons and thereby causing right thinking members of society to shun or avoid other Members and/or persons.

There are provisions however under the Standing Order preventing the conduct of certain persons to be raised by an Hon. Member other than by a substantive motion. But even if such a breach occurs and it is brought to the Member's attention and he apologises and his statement is expunded from the record of the proceedings the offending statement might well be published in the media.

A Member of this Hon. House can maliciously and falsely attack a member of the public and the Speaker may have no power to censure that Member. Such an attack may also be published.

The publication of such statements although malicious and slanderous is privileged if it is a fair and accurate report of the proceedings and it is published contemporaneously.

Hon. Members, as you are aware, we now have contemporaneous radio and television coverage of proceedings in this House. Recause of this I will be failing in my duty as Speaker if I do not remind Hon. Members that the privilege of the right of free speech; if abused, can cause conflict among citizens and severe pain, hardship and ruin.

If despite this reminder any Hon. Member should abuse this privilege steps must be taken to protect citizens whose rights may be infringed and who will be denied legal redress, also to prevent any incitement to racial hostility.

I think it must be the duty of the media to exercise responsible editorial judgement on their reports. Statements which may tend to incite ill will among citizens and/or are libelous ought to be edited before publication or denied publication altogether.

On the 7th day of January, 1903, the Hon. Moses Naciamootoo, the Senior Minister of Information said in this House that the Government has taken steps for extensive coverage by the media of parliamentary proceedings. The media must however be on quard to ensuring that the freedom of the press is not abused. I wish to remind Hor. Members and the media of the power of the Speaker under Standing Order 81 which permits representatives of the media to attend the sitting of this House at the Speaker's pleasure."
