#### ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE SPEAKER

# (i) <u>Visit of Delegation from National People's Congress of Feople's</u> Republic of China

The Speaker invited the attention of Members to the presence at the sitting of a Delegation from the National People's Congress of the People's Republic of China.

The Speaker stated that the Delecation was headed by Her Excellency Madame Chen Mu Hua, Vice Chairperson of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress, and comprised of three other persons from the Congress and some supporting staff. A full list of the Members of the Delecation including some biographical data on Malame Chen was circulated to Members of the Assembly. Madame Chen is the highest ranking female Party and Government functionary of the People's Pepublic of China.

The Delecation arrived in Guyana on 30th June, 1993 as part of a Caribbean tour which included Mexico, Barbadas and Suriname.

The Speaker, on behalf of the National Assembly, extended a ... warm welcome to Madame Chen and the other Memhers and Officials of Ther Deleration, and wished them a pleasant and successful stay in Guyana.

While in Guyana, the Delegation would Zfamiliarizing themselves with the aspects of Guyanese cultural life and activities and would be visiting acricultural and industrial sites and projects. They will be making calls on Ministers. The Delegation is scheduled to leave Guyana on Monday, 5th July, 1993.

The Speaker informed Members that the Delegation called an him yesterday and made a presentation of a mini bus to the Parliament Office and that the bus was in the front driveway of the Public Buildings Compsund. It is a new beige fifteen seater Toyota Hiace.

The Speaker stated that this was the first vehicle that the Parliament Office had obtained. The Office took action and had the hus registered on .st. July1993 as PEF 76, and the Office name was painted thereon.

The Speaker also stated that the Parliament Office will be seeking approval for the inclusion in its establishment of a new position of Driver and of the necessary financial provision required and will thereafter appoint the Driver.

The Speaker, on behalf of the National Assembly, expressed sincere thanks to Madame Chen and, through her, to the National People's Congress of the People's Republic of China for the very generous gift to the Parliament Office of a mini bus.

The Speaker further stated that with the need for transportation, the bus was most welcome and will be of great use to the Office. He invited Madame Chen and her Delegation to remain for the proceedings at the sitting of the National Assembly.

Mr. Earl Maxwell Gladstone Wilson, a former Member, was awarded the Order of Roraima (0.R.), for his outstanding service in the field of education and in the strucgle for the independence of Guyana.

Mr. Brindley Horatio Benn, a rresent Member, was awarded the Cacique's Crown of Honouc (C.C.H.), for his outstanding service in the field of politics, especially in the structle for the independence of Guyana and the restoration of democracy in Guyana.

Mr. Cedric Vernon Hunes, a former Member, was awarded the Cacique's Crown of Honour (c.C.H.), for his outstanding service in the field of education and the standard for the independence of Guyana.

## (iv) Fortieth Anniversary of Ministerial System

The Speaker also informed Memhers that the 18th of May, 1993, marked the 40th Anniversary of the first sitting of the Legislature of this country under a new Constitution which provided, for the first time for inter alia, a Ministerial system of Government and the Office of Speaker.

Of the persons who were legislators on that occasion, forty years ago, only one is a Member of the present Parliament, and that person is Mrs. Janet Janan. In that Legislative body, Mrs Janan was the Deputy Speaker. She was therefore the first Deputy Speaker of Guyana and the only woman so far to hold that Office.
