BILL - Second and Third Readings

ITEM 3 - DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION (DECLARATION OF AREAS) BILL 1995 -

Bill No. 19/1995 published 21.11.95

The Senior Minister of Agriculture (Leader of the House) moved the second reading of the following Bill:

A BILL intituled AN ACT to provide for the declaration of certain areas of land owned by the Guyana Sugar Corporation Limited, as drainage and irrigation areas, for the construction of certain works therein and for purposes connected therewith or incidental thereto.

The Bill was taken through its remaining stages and was <u>passed</u> with the following corrections:-

Clause 5

The words "section 6(6)" were substituted for the words "section 6(7)" in the first line.

Clause 6

The words "20th November, 1995" were substituted for the words "14th February, 1994" in subsection (7)(a).

The word "not" was inserted between the words "but" and "defined" in subsection (7)(c).
