In Committee

Clause 1 was passed as printed.

Clause 2 was passed with the following corrections:-

The letter "(q)" was inserted before the definition "psychological abuse".

The word "deprivation" was substituted for the word "destruction" in the definition "psychological abuse".

<u>Clause 3</u> was <u>passed</u> with the following <u>amendments</u> which were moved by the Senior Minister of Labour, Human Services and Social Security:-

The words "than merely" were inserted after the word "otherwise" in subsection (1)(d).

The words "for the child" were inserted after the word "responsibility" in subsection (2)(b).

Clauses 4 to 28 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 29</u> was <u>passed</u> with the following <u>amendment</u> which was moved by the Senior Minister of Labour, Human Services and Social Security:-

Insertion of the words "protection order is served on the respondent;" after the words "when the" in subsection (5)(b).

Clause 30 was passed as printed.

Clause 31 was passed with the following corrections:The word "filed" was substituted for the word
"filled" in subsection (1).

The words "subsection (1)" were substituted for the word "subsection" in subsection (2).

The word "officer" was substituted for the word "office" in subsection (2)(c).

Clauses 32 and 33 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 34</u> was <u>passed</u> with the following <u>amendment</u> which was moved by the Senior Minister of Labour, Human Services and Social Security:-

The words "offence under section 32, he shall make an arrest without a warrant." were inserted after the word "an".

Clause 35 was passed as printed.

<u>Clause 36</u> was <u>passed</u> with the following <u>amendments</u> which were moved by the Senior Minister of Labour, Human Services and Social Security:-

Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) was deleted and the following substituted therefor:-

"(c) that the defendant not being in a locality in which are situated the premises in which a specified person including the person named in the protection order or any relevant child resides or works;".

Insertion of the words "grounds that a person who has been admitted to bail subject to one or more of the conditions set out in" after the words "reasonable" in subsection (2).

Clauses 37 - 42 were passed as printed.

Clause 43 was passed with the following correction:-

The word "persons" was substituted for the word "person" in subsection (3).

Clause 44 was passed with the following correction:-

Deletion of the word "or" in subsection (1)(h).

Clauses 45 to 48 and the Schedule were passed as printed.

Assembly resumed.

Third Reading

On a motion by the Senior Minister of Labour, Human Services and Social Security, the Bill was read the third time and <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u>.
