ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE SPEAKER

(i) New Year Greetings

As that was the first sitting for this year, the Speaker welcomed Members and extended best wishes to them for 1997.

(ii) Resignation of Dr. Kenneth F.S. King

The Speaker announced that he had received a letter dated 28th December, 1996, from Dr. Kenneth F.S. King, resigning his seat in the National Assembly, with effect from 1st January, 1997.

With his resignation, Dr. King had, in accordance with paragraph (1)(a) of article 156 of the Constitution, vacated his seat in the Assembly.

The Speaker stated that, in accordance with section 99A of the Representation of the People Act, Chapter 1:03, he had called upon the representative of the list of candidates in which Dr. King's name was included, to further extract from the said list the name of a person to fill the vacancy in the Assembly.

The Speaker, on behalf of Members and himself, extended good wishes to Dr. King.

(iii) Leave

The Speaker announced that leave had been granted to Miss Joan Richards, up to the end of February.

(iv) Death of Mr. I.R. King, former Assistant Clerk of the Legislature

The Speaker announced that he had learnt that Mr. Ingram Randolph King, a former Assistant Clerk of the Legislature, died in the U.S.A. on the 29th December, 1996, at the age of 92 years.

Mr. King was the first holder of the Office of Assistant Clerk of the Legislature which was first created with the new Constitution in 1953. He served in that Office and as a Table Officer from 4th May, 1953, to 8th February, 1955.

The Speaker, on behalf of Members and himself, expressed deep regret at his passing.

MOTION FOR THE APPROVAL OF ESTIMATES OF EXPENDITURE FOR 1997 (1997 BUDGET)

In accordance with article 171(2) of the Constitution, the Senior Minister of Finance signified that Cabinet had recommended that the National Assembly should proceed upon the motion for the approval of the Estimates of Expenditure for the financial year 1997.

The Senior Minister of Finance then moved the motion for the approval of the Estimates of Expenditure for the financial year 1997 of the total sum of \$35,387,034,000, excluding \$14,518,402,000, which is chargeable by law (see Appendix).

The Senior Minister read the Budget Speech.

The motion was then proposed.

APPENDIX

MOTION BY THE MINISTER OF FINANCE

WHEREAS the Constitution of Guyana requires that estimates of the revenue and expenditure of Guyana for any financial year should be laid before the National Assembly;

AND WHEREAS the Constitution also provides that when the estimates of expenditure have been approved by the Assembly an Appropriation Bill shall be introduced in the Assembly providing for the issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sums necessary to meet that expenditure;

AND WHEREAS estimates of revenue and expenditure of Guyana for the financial year 1997 have been prepared and laid before the Assembly on 1997-01-17;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly approves the estimates of expenditure for the financial year 1997, of a total sum of thirty-five billion, three hundred and eighty-seven million and thirty-four thousand dollars (\$35,387,034,000), excluding fourteen billion, five hundred and eighteen million, four hundred and two thousand dollars (\$14,518,402,000) which is chargeable by law, as detailed therein and summarised in the undermentioned schedule, and agree that it is expedient to amend the law and to make further provision in respect of finance.
