ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE SPEAKER

(1) Acknowledgement from Widow of W.A. Blair

The Speaker reminded Members that following the death of William Alexander Blair, a former Parliamentarian, the National Assembly at sitting on 14th March, 1985, had passed a Resolution in which it had paid tribute to the distinguished service which Cde. Blair had rendered to Guyana and to its Parliament, and had directed that an expression of the Assembly's · sympathy be conveyed to the sorrowing widow and children of Cde. Blair. He informed the Members that in an acknowledgement, Cde. Sybil Blair, the widow of Cde. Blair, expressed the grateful thanks of her family and herself to the Members of Parliament for their kind thoughts and that they had been touched and comforted in being remembered by Members.

The Speaker informed Members that he had received through the Ambassador of the USSR in Guyana, a copy of an Address by the Central Committee of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, the Presidium of the USSR Supreme Soviet and the Council of Ministers of the USSR. The Address had been made for the occasion of the 40th Anniversary of the end of World War II and had been sent to Peoples, Parliaments and Governments of all countries.
