## BILL - Second and Third Readings

## TITEM 3 - SALE OF TRAVEL TICKETS BILL 1985 - Bill No. 10/1985 published 1985-07-27

The Minister of Transport moved the second reading of the following Bill:

A Bill intituled An Act to provide for the regulation of the sale and purchase of travel tickets.

Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud, Mr. M.F. Singh and the Vice-President, First Deputy Prime Minister and Attorney General spoke to the motion.

Thereafter the Minister of Transport replied.

The motion was put and carried.

The Bill was read a accord time.

Assembly resolved itself into Committee to consider the Bill clause by clause.

#### In Committee

Clause 1 was passed as printed.

<u>Clause2</u> was <u>passed</u> as <u>printed</u> with the following correction:

Insertion of the word "a" between the words
"such" and "manner in the fourth line of
paragraph (f).

#### Clauses 3 to 5 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 6:</u> The Minister of Transport moved the following amendment which was put and <u>carried:</u>

<u>Insertion</u> of the following after subsection (4):

- "(5) Without prejudice to the provisions of subsection (4), where the Minister is satisfied that a scheduled journey by a citizen of Guyana, not ordinarily resident in Guyana, is for the purpose of -
  - (a) medical treatment of the citizen; or
  - (b) any course of study or research he seeks to undertake, being a course of study or research to undertake which he is adequately qualified,

and facilities for the medical treatment or the course of study or research, as the case may be, are not available in Guyana, and that the other circumstances of the case justify it, the Minister may, in writing, exempt that citizen from the provisions of subsection (1) in relation to that scheduled journey.

- (6) Where the whole or part of -
  - (a) the price of a travel ticket for a scheduled journey; or
  - (b) the tax payable in accordance with the provisions of section 57 of the Tax Act or section 3 of the Travel Voucher Tax Act,

paid in a specified foreign currency, is required to be refunded under any law, or contract relating to the purchase of the travel ticket, the refund shall be made in the currency in which the payment of the price of the travel ticket or of the tax was made, in accordance with the procedure specified by order by the Minister assigned responsibility for finance".

<u>Clause</u> 6 was then <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u> with the following correction:

<u>Insertion</u> of the word "Tax" between the words "Voucher" and "Act" in the sixth line of subsection (1).

Clauses 7 to 11 were passed as printed.

<u>Clause 12:</u> The following amendment by the Minister of Transport was put and <u>carried:</u>

<u>Insertion</u> of "or any order made under section 6(6)" immediately after the words "Section 6(1)".

Clause 12 was then passed as amended.

Clause 13 was passed as printed.

<u>Clause 14:</u> The following amendment by the Minister was put and <u>carried</u>:

Deletion of the clause.

#### Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Transport the Bill was read the third time and <u>passed</u> as <u>amended</u> and <u>corrected</u> in Committee.

At 17:50 hrs on a motion by the Minister of Home Affairs, the Assembly was adjourned to a date to be fixed.
