# ITEM 10 - CONFIRMATION OF CUSTOMS DUTIES (AMENDMENT) (No. 2) ORDER 1985 (No. 56)

The Minister of Home Affairs, on behalf of the Minister of Finance, moved the following motion which was put and <u>carried</u>:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly, in accordance with section 9 of the Customs Act, Chapter 82:01, confirm the Customs Duties (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1985 (No. 56), which was made on 26th September, 1985, and published in the Gazette on 28th September, 1985.

### ITEM 11 - ADOPTION OF ILO CONVENTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Minister of Manpower and Co-operatives moved the following motion which was put and <u>carried</u>:

WHEREAS as a member state of the International Labour Organisation, Guyana is obligated to examine Conventions and Recommendations adopted by the International Labour Conference in accordance with Article 19 of the Constitution of the International Labour Organisation;

AND WHEREAS Article 19 states that all Conventions and Recommendations adopted by the International Labour Conference must be submitted to the Competent Authority of member states whether ratification of such Conventions is contemplated or not;

AND WHEREAS the submission of Conventions and Recommendations adopted at sessions of that Conference should always be accompanied or followed by a statement or proposals setting out the Government's view as to the action to be taken on the instruments;

AND WHEREAS Guyana adheres to the Constitution of the International Labour Organisation of which it is a member since 1966;

AND MEREAS the Guyana Government always as an aim of policy, makes proposals at the time of submission on the applicability of the Conventions and Recommendations adopted from time to time at Sessions of the International Labour Conference;

AND WHEREAS the Government of Guyana always takes steps to ratify those Conventions which are in keeping with the social philosophy of the Guyanese Society:

### BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Asembly adopts the proposals on the Conventions and Recommendations adopted at the 69th and 70th Sessions of the International Labour Conference held in Geneva in June, 1983 and June, 1984, respectively, as laid in the National Assembly on State Paper No. 2/1985: AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the decisions of this National Assembly be conveyed to the Director General of the International Labour Organisations and to the Workers' and Employers' Organisations and other interested groups in Guyana.
