#### No. 70 - Harmful Effects of Cigarette Smoking

Mr. Kwavana asked the Minister of Medical Education, Environment and Food Policy the following question:

QUESTION: Will the Minister undertake to launch a continuous programme of public educatiom using all media on the harmful effects of cigarette smoking?

The Minister in the Ministry of Health on behalf of the Minister of Medical Education, Environment and Food Telloy gave the following reply:

ANSWER:

The programme of Public Education using the media as it relates to the harmful effects of cigarette smoking has already started.

It is part of the programme on Drug Abuse Education which was started since March 1985. This programme is on-going.

#### No. 71 - Cancer of the Breast

# Mr. Kwayana asked

- (a) the Minister in the Ministry of Health the following question:
- QUESTION: (i) Is the Minister aware of a growing incidence of cancer of the breast in Guyana?
  - (ii) Will the Minister give the assurance that public facilities free of charge will be available to assist interested persons?

and

- (b) the Minister of Medical Education, Environment and Food Policy the following question:
- QUESTION: (iii) Will the Minister launch a programme of public education, using all means, including brochures, advising women how to detect such a development at an early stage?

- ANSWER: (a) (1) The Minister is unaware of any reliable statistical data indicating an increased incidence of cancer of the breast in Guyana.
  - (ii) Public facilities free of charge are available to assist interested persons.
  - (b) (iii) All physicians and nurses while working in institutions or in the community have been oriented to effect educational programmes of our women and men relating to a wide range of areas of which early detection of changes in breast tissue is one. As resources become available brochures will be printed for distribution.

# No. 72 - Economic Activities at Hope Estate
