MOTIONS

ITEM 3 - SUPERANNUATION DENEFITS OF NON-PENSIONABLE EMPLOYEES

The <u>Minister of Information and the Public Service</u> moved and spoke to the following motion:-

WHEREAS Legislative Council Resolution No.XXV of 1940 as amended from time to time provided that an employee holding a non-pensionable appointment should be granted superannuation benefits on certain terms and conditions;

AND WHEREAS under the aforesaid Resolution, as so amended the superannuation benefits provided for therein are available to a non-pensionable employee only in the case of his retirement on account of ill-health, incapacity, inefficiency or voluntary retirement on or after the age of fifty-five years, or on abolition of post;

AND WHEREAS Government is of the view that in a case where the service of a non-pensionable employee is terminated on account of unavailability of work, closure of project, redundancy or in the public interest (not being a case where his service is terminated on disciplinary grounds or on resignation) and who has more than one but less than seven continuous years of service, should be paid a gratuity calculated —

- (a) in the case of a non-pensionable employee holding an "approved" appointment at a rate of oneeighteenth of a month's pay for each month of service; and
- (b) in the case of a non-pensionable employee not holding an "approved" appointment at a rate of one-twentysixth of a year's pay for each year of service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESELVED:

That this National Assembly approve that the aforesaid Resolution be amended in the following respects -

(a) by the renumbering of paragraph B as sub-paragraph (i) thereof and by the insertion, after sub-paragraph (i) as so renumbered, of the following subparagraph as sub-paragraph (ii) -

- "(ii) A non-pensionable employee holding an approved appointment whose service is terminated on or after 1st April, 1982, on account of unavailability of work, closure of project, redundancy or in public interest (not being a case where his service is terminated on disciplinary grounds or on resignation) and who has more than one but less than seven continuous years of service be paid a gratuity calculated at the rate of one-eighteenth of a month's pay for each month of service.";
- (b) in paragraph C, by the renumbering of sub-paragraph (ii) as sub-paragraph (iii) and by the insertion, after sub-paragraph (i), of the following subparagraph as sub-paragraph (ii) --
 - "(ii) A non-pensionable employee not holding an approved appointment whose service is terminated on or after 1st April, 1982, on account of unavailability of work, closure of project, redundancy or in public interest (not being a case where his service is terminated on disciplinary grounds or on resignation) and who has more than one but less than seven continuous years of service be paid a gratuity calculated at the rate of one-twenty-sixth of a year's pay for each year of service.";
- (c) by the insertion, after paragraph I, of the following paragraph as paragraph J -
 - "J. For the purposes of this resolution -
 - (i) "pay", for calculating gratuity payable to an employee, shall be computed on the basis of the last salary or wages drawn by the employee;
 - (ii) "approved appointment" means any
 appointment approved in that behalf by the Minister.".

Mr. Kwayana spoke to the motion and moved the following amendments to the Resolve Clause:

- (i) In (a) (ii) after the word "holding" deletion of the words "an approved appointment" and insert the following words:
 - "an approved appointment or not holding an approved appointment"
- (ii) Deletion of the provisions which follow at (b).

Cde. Delgrave seconded the amendment and spoke.

The Minister of Information and the Public Service replied.

The amendment was put and negatived.

Thereafter the original motion was put and carried.
