<u>OATHS</u>

The Speaker informed Members that when the National Assembly had first met on Monday, 3rd February, 1986, three Members had not been present to make and subscribe the oath and as two of those Members, Cde. Dr. Richard Alexander Van West-Charles, and Cde. Janet Jagan, were present at that sitting, the oath would be administered to them.

Thereafter Cde. Dr. Richard Alexander Van West-Charles and Cde. Janet Jagan made and subscribed the oath.

The Speaker congratulated Cdes. Van West-Charles and Jagan on their again becoming Members of the National Assembly and welcomed them and extended best wishes to them.

ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE SPEAKER

(i) Leave

The Speaker announced that leave had been granted to Cde. Dr. Jagan for six weeks, from 1986-02-17 and that during his absence Cde. Janet Jagan would be carrying out his functions.

(ii) Broadcast of Budget

The Speaker informed Members that, in accordance with the usual practice, he had given permission to the Guyana Broadcasting Corporation to broadcast live the Budget presentation to be made by the Minister of Finance at that sitting. The Corporation had also been given permission to record for subsequent broadcasts Speeches which would be made by other Members of the Assembly at other sittings during the budget debate. Such subsequent broadcasts would, however, have to be made in accordance with the approved practice, that is, the time used for the broadcast of speeches would have to be allotted to the Members of the Assembly in the proportion to the Party representation in the Assembly.

(iii) Public Address System

The Speaker said that permission had also been given for the installation as usual of a public address system for the budget presentation.

(iv) Bills Listed for Second Reading

The Speaker informed Members that the second reading of the Bills on the Order Paper would not be proceeded with at that sitting.

(v) <u>National Awards</u>

The Speaker informed Members that in the recent announcement of National Awards, made on the occasion of the sixteenth anniversary of the Republic, five persons who had been formerly associated with our Parliament had been granted National Awards:

- (i) Cde. Robert James Jordan who had been a Member of Parliament from 1961 to 1973 and a Minister from 1964 to 1970, had been awarded the Cacique Crown of Honour for service of an exceptionally high quality and beyond the normal call of duty in the field of politics;
- (ii) Cde. Bishwaishwar Ramsaroop who had been a Member of Parliament and a Minister from 1969 to 1984, had been awarded the Cacique Crown of Honour for service of an exceptionally high quality and beyond the normal call of duty in the field of politics;
- (iii) Cde. Joseph Adolphus Tyndall who had been a Minister and a Member of the National Assembly from 1978 to 1982, had been awarded the Cacique Crown of Honour for public and political service of an exceptionally high quality and beyond the normal call of duty at the national, regional and international level;
- (iv) Cde. Philomena Ameena Rayman who had been a Member of Parliament from 1973 to 1985 and a Parliamentary Secretary in 1981, had been awarded the Medal of Service for long service with exceptional dedication in the field of politics and in community and social work; and
- (v) Cde. Alexander Irving Crum Ewing who had been a Clerk of the Legislature from 1945 to 1963 and who had been made an Honorary Officer of Parliamont when he retired, had been awarded the Golden Arrow of Achievement for long and dedicated service of a consistently high standard in the public service.

On behalf of Members and his own, the Speaker extended and placed on record their congratulations and best wishes to the five persons.

ON DEFINITE MATTERS OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE

Fuel Crisis

Mr. Kwayana sought leave to move the adjournment of the Assembly in order to discuss the fuel crisis.

The Speaker stated that while he had permitted Mr. Kwayana to: raise and to refer to the matter which he wished to have discussed, Mr. Kwayana had not, in the first place, satisfied the requirement of

Standing Order No. 11(2), i.e he had not provided the Speaker before the commencement of the sitting with a written notification of the matter to be discussed.

The Speaker further said that even if Mr. Kwayana had satisfied the requirement of the Standing ()rder, he would have been preculed from allowing the matter to be discussed on a motion for the adjournment of tho

Assembly at that time, as an early parliamentary opportunity was shortly to occur i.e, when the 1986 Budget and Estimates were to be debated and considered, and on which occasion the matter could properly be raised and discussed.

Suspension of Standing Orders 9(2) and 32 (a)

On a motion by the Minister of Manpower, Housing and Environment, paragraph (2) of Standing Order No. 9 and paragraph (9) of Standing Order No. 32 were suspended to enable the Minister of Finance to complete the reading of the budget speech uninterrupted and to enable the sitting to continue beyond 16:00 hrs if necessary, without being suspended.

A Bill intituled An Act to amend the Banking Act and the Bank of Guyana Act.
