ITEM I - AMENDMENT TO STANDING ORDERS - RECESS FOR NATIONAL ASSEMBLY Notice Paper No. 82 published 1906-06-11

The Prime Minister moved the following motion:

WHEREAS the President in his address at the ceremonial opening of the first session of the Fifth Parliament of Guyana on the fourth day of February, 1986 referred to the advantages to the members if the National Assembly were to go into recess for a specified period;

AND WHEREAS this National Assembly having considered the above suggestion of the President is of the opinion that the National Assembly should go into recess for a specified period to enable the members thereof to attend to public matters, other than the work of this National Assembly, and their private matters;

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Standing Orders of the National Assembly be amended as proposed in the Annexure hereto to provide for a period of recess for the National Assembly between 10th August and 10th October in any year:

AND DE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That request be made to the President that he shall have regard to the wish of the National Assembly in this respect while exercising the powers conferred on him by article 69(1) of the Constitution.

ANNEXURE

Draft of proposed amendment

The Standing Orders of the National Assembly are hereby amended by the insertion therein, after Standing Order No. 0, of the following Standing Order as Standing Order No. 8A \sim

"Recess for National Assembly. OA. Notwithstanding anything contained in Standing Order No. O, unless there are special reasons for so doing, no sitting of the National Assembly shall be held from 10th August, to 10 th October in any year.".

ITEM 3 - PROVISION OF WATER - Notice Paper No. 14 published 1986-03-06

Ede Janet Jagan moved the following motion:

BE IT RESCLVED:

That the National Assembly urges the Government to solve the many pure water supply problems existing throughout the country and resolve to provide every community with a functioning potable water system.

Mr. M.F. Singh seconded and spoke to the motion.

The Minister within the Office of the President spoke to the notion and moved the following amendment:-

Substitution of the words "approves of the steps being taken by the Government to solve such pure water supply problems as exist in the country and" for the words "urges the Government to solve the many pure water supply problems existing throughout the country and resolve".

AND WHEREAS milk cannot be eliminated from the diet of our children:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly calls on the Government to see that adequate supplies of milk are imported and equitably distributed in order to supplement the present inadequate supplies of locally-produced milk.
