## THE ELECTION REGULATIONS 1964

THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE (ADAPTATION AND  
MODIFICATION OF LAWS) ACT, 1968.NOTICE APPOINTING THE DAY ON WHICH LISTS OF CANDIDATES  
MAY BE SUBMITTED TO THE CHIEF ELECTION OFFICER.

WHEREAS the Governor-General acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister has appointed Monday, the 16th day of December, 1968, as the day on which an election of members to serve in the National Assembly is to be held pursuant to Article 67 of the Constitution and section 5 of the Representation of the People (Adaptation and Modification of Laws) Act, 1968.

AND WHEREAS it is provided by regulation 9 of the Election Regulations 1964, as amended by the First Schedule to the Representation of the People (Adaptation and Modification of Laws) Act, 1968, that the Minister shall by notice published in the Gazette appoint a day being a day not later than the 39th day before election day on which lists of candidates may be submitted to the Chief Election Officer.

NOW THEREFORE TAKE NOTICE that I, CLIFTON MORTIMER LLEWELLYN JOHN, the Minister to whom responsibility for elections is for the time being assigned DO HEREBY APPOINT Thursday, the 7th day of November, 1968, as the day on which lists of candidates may be submitted to the Chief Election Officer.

Lists of candidates as aforesaid may be submitted between the hours of 8.00 a.m. in the forenoon and 1.00 p.m. in the afternoon on the aforesaid 7th day of November, 1968, to the Chief Election Officer, at the Election Office, Camp Road, Eve Leary, Georgetown, in the county of Demerara, Guyana.

The lists must, in accordance with regulation 11 of the aforesaid Regulations be submitted in the prescribed form. One copy of each list must be submitted with its original and a statutory declaration in the prescribed form by each person named therein as a candidate of his qualifications and consent made before a justice of the peace, commissioner of oaths, notary public or other person authorised by law to administer an oath where the declaration is made must accompany the list. The prescribed forms for lists of candidates and statutory declarations are now obtainable from the Elections Office, Camp Road, Eve Leary, Georgetown.
